

Welcome to Healthy Gator's News for the 2025-2026 School Year!

Hi, my name is **Nurse Melissa**, and I will be the NEW school nurse here at HNJ. I am here to help keep our students safe by providing both first aid and triage care. I am also able to provide daily medications, booster doses, and any other interventions needed for those students with medical needs. I am the main point of contact for all health and medical information, and you can email me any time at mcastillo@hnjschool.org. Nurse Caroline and Nurse Abby will still be around to help me out when needed. I know it is going to be a great school year and I am looking forward to meeting you all.

Before the start of school, all Gators must:

- Complete this HNJ Medical Form on the previous page (fill out one form for each student) by Tuesday, August 5th.
- Email Nurse Melissa a copy of each student's immunization record by Friday, August 15th.
- Make sure each student's contact information is up to date in the Family Portal.
 - Current emergency contact names and numbers are necessary to have on file throughout the school year in case of an emergency or illness.
 - If a contact, phone number, or address changes throughout the middle of the year please remember to update this information accordingly.

Health Reminders:

- If your child is diagnosed with a communicable illness or disease during the school year, you must email Nurse Melissa in order to notify the correct homerooms and classrooms of the case through email.
- These illnesses include: lice, pinworm and ringworm, hand foot and mouth, impetigo, scabies, rotavirus, norovirus, and RSV.
- * Please review the Health and Safety Policies Section of the Student/ Family Handbook here to further familiarize yourself with our policies regarding illness, medications, and immunizations for the school year.

Remember: MEDICATIONS (BOTH OVER-THE-COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION) REQUIRE FORMS TO BE COMPLETED FOR ADMINISTRATION AT SCHOOL BY THE SCHOOL NURSE. MEDICATIONS ARE NEVER TO BE SENT IN A STUDENT'S BACKPACK. THEY MUST BE DROPPED OFF TO THE FRONT OFFICE AND CHECKED OFF BY THE NURSE.

I am excited to be a member of the GATOR community and for this new school year! It is my pleasure as the school nurse to care for all of our HNJ Gators and keep them healthy and well!





- · Navy Land's End jumper with embroidered LG logo
- · Bloomers to be worn under dresses (any brand)
- · Peter Pan collar with embroidered Little Gator logo.
- · Any red, navy, or blue solid or gingham shorts, leggings, or bloomers.
- White socks or leggings
- · Velcro-only sneakers in white, red, black, or navy.

PK3-KINDER GIRLS

- · Red Young Fashions gingham dress and bloomers with logo on collar
- Optional initial embroidery on opposite collar)
- HNJ Socks

1ST-4TH GRADE GIRLS

- · Land's End plaid skirt, skort, or jumper
- · Land's End cotton Peter Pan collar shirt with embroidered logo (long or short sleeve)
- HNJ Socks
- · PE Shorts from SquadLocker are required under girls' skirts. Any style of shorts may be purchased from the shop, with any of our HNJ logos applied. Shorts without a logo are not allowed.

MIDDLE SCHOOL GIRLS



EARLY CHILDHOOD READINESS CHECKLISTS











As we prepare for the upcoming 2025–2026 school year, we want to share important information regarding required summer assignments for students entering 1st through 7th grade.

To support your child's continued growth in reading and math, each student will be expected to complete the following over the summer:

Summer Reading - REQUIRED

- Each grade level has selected a required book or novel. (Rising 1st should choose a book to read each night.)
- Students must complete the accompanying assignment, which will be used for a formative assessment grade in the 1st Trimester.
- Middle school students who may qualify for advanced ELA will be assigned additional summer work at the beginning of July.

Summer Math - REQUIRED

- Each student will complete a math review packet based on content from the current school year.
- All students must show their work on the packet to receive full credit.
- This assignment will also be used as a formative assessment grade in the 1st Trimester.
- Middle school students who may qualify for advanced Math will be assigned additional summer work at the beginning of July.

DUE DATE

- All summer assignments—both reading and math—are due on Monday, August 18, 2025.
- Please ensure your child brings completed work with them on the first Monday of school.
- Late assignments will receive a grade of 50 and must still be completed.

PADDITIONAL NOTES

- All assignments will be emailed to families and posted on the school website here.
- Printed copies will not be sent home, but families may pick up a printed version from the school office if needed.
- If you choose, i-Ready is still available this summer for returning students.


