Bible Study for Women


After the craziness of the holidays, and during the darkest, dullest days of winter, wouldn't you like to spend a little time feeding your spirit?

Stewardship Thoughts



The topics of family honor and obedience connect today's Scripture passages. The Book of Sirach instructs those who respectfully honor their father and revere their mother, atone for their sins and in turn, store up riches. Those who are caregivers for aging parents are also remembered - their generosity is planted as an offering against sin. In St. Luke's Gospel, Mary and Joseph find Jesus in the Temple after a frantic three-day search. The evangelist tells of their return to Nazareth, where Jesus is *obedient to them.* Pope St. John Paul II emphasized the family as the "Domestic Church." Archbishop Allen Vigneron also discusses the importance of the "Domestic Church" in his pastoral letter, *Unleash the Gospel* (see Guidepost 7, Families). Please pray for faith-filled families, as their discipleship is the foundation for vocations to the priesthood, religious life, permanent diaconate, and other ministries to the Church.



DRIVERS NEEDED

Hundreds of older and disabled neighbors in our community need help getting to doctor appointments, the grocery story, or other essential errands. Being able to get food and medical care can make it possible for them to remain in their own homes for as long as possible.

The Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers Program is in need of volunteers who can provide transportation in the local area. We especially need drivers who are available during daytime business hours - mornings and afternoons. If you have just a couple hours a month that you can give to someone in need, you can make a huge difference in the life of a struggling neighbor. You tell us what days, times and areas are convenient for you, and we call you with specific appointments that meet these criteria. If you are free, say yes. If you're not, simply decline and we will call you another time.




