Father Bogdan's Corner

Today is the last Sunday of Ordinary Time and we celebrate the Solemnity of our Lord, Christ Jesus King of the Universe. It is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius XI instituted this Solemnity in 1925 after World War I. In the context of the struggle ideological and political powers. Jesus Christ was enthroned as a King of the Universe. Please read what Pope Pius XI wrote: "If to Christ our Lord is given all power in heaven and on earth; if all men, purchased by his precious blood, are by a new right subjected to his dominion; if this power embraces all men, it must be clear that not one of our faculties is exempt from his empire. He must reign in our minds, which should assent with perfect submission and firm belief to revealed truths and to the doctrines of Christ. He must reign in our wills which should obey the laws and precepts of God. He must reign in our hearts, which should spurn natural desires and love God above all things and cleave to him alone. He must reign in our bodies and in our members, which should serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls, or to use the words of the Apostle Paul, as instruments of justice unto God". Today we experience even more conflicts, struggles, hatred, the economic war, the examples come from these who are involved in politics. Accepting Jesus Christ as the King of all of us would unite us, put us on the same "page".

As you know I like to know the wisdom of the commissions and one of the suggestions is that during the winter when we hear on the radio or TV about the school closings, due to inclement weather, that we should also cancel morning Mass and the office would be closed. Talk among yourselves, talk with the Chairpersons of the Parish Council, Finance Council and the Worship Commission and express your opinion. I myself think that it is a good idea not to put people on the road when the weather is bad. It is not safe to drive, walk or get sick. Every morning at 8 a.m. & 12 noon there is a Holy Mass broadcasted on EWTN TV for shut ins.

On Thursday, citizens of the United States, people of different religions, political orientation will sit down at the table and in the spirit of Thanksgiving to GOD will eat turkey prepared with love and for some the joint effort of their family. Make your dining room and table like the altar in our church, where all family members may enjoy each other. In the morning at 9:00 a.m. we will offer Morning Mass. Please come and join us and after that sit at your "home altar" such as your table and enjoy family and friends.

Next weekend is already the first Sunday of Advent, the New Year of the Church begins. The lectionary cycles are as follows: Sundays – Year A, weekday Cycle II. It is a time to express our hunger and thirst for Jesus: "Maranatha!" "Come, Lord Jesus!" I hope that you enjoy our new Sanctuary of our beautiful church. It is good for us to be at our warm and friendly church to pray.



Growing Faith...Engaging Hearts

President George Washington's Thanksgiving Day Proclamation of 1789

WHEREAS it is the duty of all nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey His will, to be grateful for His benefits, and humbly to implore His protection and favor; and Whereas both Houses of Congress have, by their joint committee, requested me "to recommend to the people of the United States a Day of public Thanksgiving and Prayer, to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many and signal favors of Almighty God, especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness:"

NOW THEREFORE, I do recommend and assign Thursday, the twenty-sixth day of November next, to be devoted by the people of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being who is the beneficent author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be; that we may then all unite in rendering unto Him our sincere and humble thanks for His kind care and protection of the people of this country previous to their becoming a nation; for the signal and manifold mercies and the favorable interpositions of His providence in the course and conclusion of the late war; for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty which we have since enjoyed;— for the peaceable and rational manner in which we have been enabled to establish Constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national one now lately instituted;— for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed, and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge;— and, in general, for all the great and various favors which He has been pleased to confer upon us.

AND ALSO, that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions;—to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually; to render our National Government a blessing to all the people by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed; to protect and guide all sovereigns and nations (especially such as have shown kindness unto us); and to bless them with good governments, peace, and concord; to promote the knowledge and practice of true religion and virtue, and the increase of science among them and us; and, generally to grant unto all mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as he alone knows to be best.
