Father Bogdan's Corner

It is already the Second Sunday of Advent. People are decorating their homes to show that they are ready to welcome Jesus. Maybe it would be appropriate to recall a Centurion from Capernaum, who even hearing about Jesus had asked himself "Am I worthy to have you under my roof?" John the Baptist, who I consider the second after the Blessed Virgin Mary as the figure of Advent, teaches us: "Prepare the way of the Lord make straight his paths". Make your lives straight by controlling your bad habits and your worries. Awake and break them through the healing power of the Sacrament of Mercy such as Reconciliation, that will be at St. Martin de Porres on December 13th at 7:00 p.m. To me, the Blessed Virgin Mary is the first person of Advent because after saying "I am your handmade" she waited for this moment in history to begin a new era, by giving birth to the Son of God, Emanuel. Such a great blessing to the world. We have to be thankful for the Immaculate Conception, as it means that she was free from original sin by virtue of the merits of her Son Jesus. She was free and we have to pay for the consequences of the original sin. Jesus is helping us to overcome our inclination toward sins.

Welcome the statues of the BVM from Guadeloupe, that is also known as Our Lady of Guadeloupe. Tomorrow, in addition to the regular Monday Morning Mass at 9 a.m., we are also having a 6:00 p.m. Mass for the students. All are invited.

Monsignor Robert McClory Named to Lead Diocese of Gary, Indiana

Pope Francis has appointed Monsignor Robert McClory, 56, to be the fifth bishop of the Diocese of Gary, Indiana. The Diocese of Gary is in northwest Indiana, on the southern shore of Lake Michigan, and has a Catholic population of 168,500 and a total population of 786,000. Bishop-elect McClory, currently serving as pastor and rector of the National Shrine of the Little Flower Basilica in Royal Oak, Michigan, will be ordained as bishop and installed on February 11, 2020. He will succeed Bishop Donald Hying, who was appointed Bishop of Madison, Wisconsin in April of this year.

Bishop-elect McClory was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit on May 22, 1999. Prior to his assignment as pastor of the National Shrine of the Little Flower Basilica, Bishop-elect McClory served as Moderator of the Curia and Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Detroit from 2009–2018, Chancellor from 2003–2009 and Administrative Secretary to Cardinal Adam Maida from 2002–2003. He also served as Pastor of Presentation/Our Lady of Victory Parish, Detroit, from 2011–2017; parochial vicar of St. Isidore Parish, Macomb Township, from 2001–2002 and St. Therese of Lisieux Parish, Shelby Township, from 2000–2001; Weekend Associate at Our Lady of the Lakes Parish, Waterford, from 2002–2004 and St. Blase Parish, Sterling Heights from 2004–2011.

"Here in Monsignor McClory's home diocese, he is recognized as a zealous priest who generously devotes all the talents God has blessed him with to the ministry of spreading the Gospel," said Detroit Archbishop Allen Vigneron.

Oplatik

Oplatik is available in the parish office. Suggested donation is \$5.00.

I would like to explain to those who don't know what it is and why it is used. Sharing Oplatik or Christmas Wafer is a Polish Christmas tradition. Before partaking of the Christmas Eve meal – "Vigilia" the family gathers around the table, and the father or mother or even the eldest member of the Family breaks the "Oplatik" into small pieces and gives to each member of the family a piece. Holding it in their hand, they approach each other and take from each other a little piece and express Christmas wishes and wishes for the coming New Year too. The sharing of the Christmas wafer symbolizes the unity of the family which many consider to be the main pillar of society. According to beliefs, the bond of unity should exist between family members. The father is seen as the link in the unbroken chain of One body, One Bread, One Christ, and One Church, while other family members join him in this eternal procession. Sharing the wafer also symbolizes forgiveness, reconciliation and love. When everyone has exchanged the wafer, the family members return to their seats and eat their Christmas meal. It is a good ceremony to be included into Christmas observance and tradition.

Registration

Arrange at least six months in advance.
