Gospel Reflection on the Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hearing the Word (Matthew 10:26-33):

Jesus said to the Twelve: "Fear no one. Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known. What I say to you in the darkness, speak in the light; what you hear whispered, proclaim on the housetops. And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

Reflecting on the Word:


Emphasizing God's wisdom, Jesus instructs his Apostles on how to live openly in God's love. If God cares for the tiny sparrows, he would care for us even more. No matter is too small for God. We only have to trust in him.

We all need reassurance about God's love and care. It is important to demonstrate your belief that your family is precious and cared for by God in your prayer and your actions. If there are particular problems or anxieties that you are struggling with, bring them to God in prayer. Trust in God's care.

How has God been with you in times of fear, grief or pain? What about the happy, joyful times?

How does it make you feel to know that God knows everything about you, even the number of hairs on your head?

Since today is Father's Day, think about one thing for which you are or were grateful about your earthly father or your Father in heaven.

The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. Arrange at least six months in advance.
