Father Bogdan's Corner

As we are approaching the end of Summer, it is time to prepare our Activity Center for 2020/21 Religious Education Program for the Children and Confirmation Students. We do this in such a unique time when COVID-19 does not allow us to offer you the traditional way of education and spiritual formation of our young parishioners. Schools, Day Cares, Religious Education Programs are the extension of the family. They, on behalf of the father or mother or entire family, are educating your children. Like a family is concerned about the health of their children, so are we. We want to offer good knowledge about our Catholic faith and tradition. At this time of the coronavirus we want to provide a good, safe and healthy environment, while following the rules of the State and the AoD. There is always a risk at your home, store, church, or restaurants to get the virus. We live with it, we are aware of it, but at the same time we do everything we can to protect ourselves and others from spreading the virus. Our Church, Offices and Activity Center are very well sanitized. Our staff is doing a great job and I am thankful to all employees including our 3 janitors' for being cautious.

I am appealing to all people attending services and entering our property to be cautious, keep distance and wear your mask properly. You must keep your mask on over your nose and mouth while you are in the buildings. When you receive the Eucharist, you remove for a moment and replace the mask quickly. For the reception of Holy Communion, the Usher's **DO NOT NEED** to stand and direct the traffic to the stations where communion is offered. I see that participants at the Mass are mature enough to take care of themselves.

Keeping the above in mind, we are ready to take registration for religious classes that will be offered in classrooms. We have a large area that allows us to maintain social distance. We need to have the number of students for regular religion classes, **First Holy Communion** and **Confirmation**. Based on the number of students, we will prepare the schedule for the classes, days of the week and number of classes for the entire school year. In the past we offered 30 classes, however because of COVID-19 there may be a few less this year. Please fill out the form on page 5 to register your student. You can drop them in the mailbox outside of the main office, mail them or put them in the collection next week. Please do not delay, we need this information to get the program underway.

Act of Spiritual Communion

It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion means uniting one's self in prayer with Christ's sacrifice and worshipping Him in His Body and Blood. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily.

My Jesus,

I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.

I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You in my soul.

Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.

I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

I saw Father Andrasz as he was saying Holy Mass today. Before the elevation, I saw the Infant Jesus with His hands spread out, and He was very joyous; then, after a moment, I saw nothing more. I was in my room and I continued making my thanksgiving. But later on, I thought to myself, "Why was the Infant Jesus so merry: After all, He is not always so merry when I see Him." Then I heard the words interiorly: **Because I am very much at home in his heart.** And I was not at all surprised at this, because I know he loves Jesus very much. 879 page 344
