Tomorrow, October 12 at 6 p.m. in the Activity Center, we will host our first religious class for students and their parents to begin our 2020/2021 Catechetical Year. It will be an orientation class and from that day forward, once a week on Monday's, we will provide a catholic education for children and youth until December 7, 2020. Hopefully, with the pandemic, we will be able to continue our classes after the first of the year. I hope and pray that COVID-19 will not sabotage our plans. Parents, children, teachers, my staff and myself—we all are taking a risk. To minimize this risk, we follow COVID-19 regulations dictated by our Governor and the AoD. Maintenance will be at the doors to sanitize it. Parents, students and teachers must wear a mask and please maintain social distance of at least 6'. Upon entering, students and parents will have their temperatures taken. For the first part of the class, I as the Pastor of the Parish, will address students and parents and once again parents will be requested to fill out a more detailed form, that in the case of emergency, we will have the information to contact the parent. After my presentation, students will meet their catechists. To make life easier all the questions or problems or to report an absence, parents will call directly with the catechists. The Catechist will have all the answers. In the case of further assistance you may call to the parish office at (586) 772-2720 to talk directly to me. We are in the office daily, however in accordance with the AoD the office doors remain locked. You may call to set up an appointment.

On Sunday October 18 at 11 a.m. there will be a Children's and Youth Mass. For this Mass please bring all school items to be blessed: backpacks, notebooks, iPad, smart phones—pack everything that you use in school in your backpack and bring to the church. I hate to say that this is **obligatory**, I cannot force you to come to the church, but I am begging you, as parents, to help your children to have in their life a religious experience. Our church is very safe and can accommodate 300 people plus, during the pandemic. We have sophisticated equipment to disinfect the church after the Mass so everyone can feel safe in our church.

Excerpts from St. Faustina's Diary

St. Faustina's Diary is a compilation of her personal spiritual journey: how she encountered Jesus and what He said directly to her. It's a beautiful testimony of faith, showing how trust in the Lord, especially in times of uncertainty and doubt is absolutely essential.

January 21, 1937. Since early morning today, I have been wondrously united with the Lord. In the evening, the hospital chaplain visited me. After we had talked for a while, I felt my spirit beginning to immerse itself in God and I began to lose all sense of what was happening around me. I ardently implored Jesus, "Give me the ability to talk." And the Lord granted that I could talk freely with him. But there was a moment when I could not understand what the priest was saying. I heard his voice, but it was impossible for me to understand him, and I apologized for not understanding him although I could hear his voice. This is a moment of the grace of union with God, but imperfect, because exteriorly the senses are acting imperfectly too. There is no total immersion in God; that is suspension of the senses, as often happens when one neither sees nor hears anything exteriorly, the whole soul being freely absorbed in God. When such a grace visits me, I want to be alone, and I ask Jesus to (259) protect me from the eyes of creatures. I was really very embarrassed before the priest, but I was reassured, because he got to know a little of my soul in confession 891 page 348

Today the Lord gave me to know, in spirit, about the Convent of Divine Mercy. I saw a great spirit in this convent, but everything was poor and very scanty. O my Jesus, you are allowing me to live in spirit with these souls, but perhaps I shall never set foot there; but may Your Name be blessed, and whatever You have intended, may it be done. 892 page 349

Report Abuse

The Archdiocese of Detroit encourages individuals to report clergy sexual abuse of minors and others - no matter when the abuse occurred. Registration

Parishioners may register in person, by phone, or online.

Baptism

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. For more information call the Parish Office.

Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
