Father Bogdan's Corner

After the celebrations of the Resurrection, Ascension, Pentecost and the Holy Trinity, today we observe the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ also known as Corpus Christi. Today, in the liturgy, we celebrate the real presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of the Eucharist. It is the new way Jesus remained on the earth after his death on the cross. At the Last Supper, He took the essential fruits of human labor—bread and wine and "turned" them into His Body and Blood. In this way, He stays with us. He not only stays with us, but He makes us, those who are nourished by His Body and Blood a Mystical Body of His, where He is the Head and we are members of this entity. On Corpus Christi Sunday, we have to look for the second truth that this day contains. The first truth is His Body and Blood we receive at each Mass and the second is that we form the Mystical Body of Christ. Each one of us has a function in His Body and it depends on our involvement how the Body will exist.

The common ways we can support this living organization—this Mystical Body of Christ—are to support financially, prayerfully, defend our Church when there is a need, invite new people, talk about vocations, encourage its growth, and create a spirit of support that everyone in this Body would not be turned away.

One very important part is Catholic education that we obtain by Sunday sermons, RCIA, Alpha, Religious Education, self learning, and on every occasion that we talk about Mystical Body of Christ. I am very disappointed with the people who years ago were practicing worshippers, even went through Catholic School, but now have joined another denomination. You think that there is no corruption? Everywhere where there are humans there is corruption big or small, but we all strive for improvement.

The Church, the Mystical body of Christ is a place for spiritual and moral improvement, it is the way that leads us towards eternity. Be proud of your belonging to the Body of Christ, and celebrate it today.

We hope you can join us and make his day special!


Tickets will be \$25.00 and will be on sale after the Masses or you can call the parish office. This will be the last weekend to get your ticket.

St. Faustina's Diary is a compilation of her personal spiritual journey: how she encountered Jesus and what He said directly to her. It's a beautiful testimony of faith, showing how trust in the Lord, especially in times of uncertainty and doubt is absolutely essential.

During prayer, I heard these words: **My daughter, let your heart be filled with joy. I, the Lord, am with you Fear nothing. You are in My heart.** At that moment, I knew the great majesty of God, and I understood that nothing could be compared with one single perception of God. Outward greatness dwindles like a speck of dust before one act of a deeper knowledge of God. (1133) page 418

My tormented soul finds aid nowhere but in You, O Living Host. I place all my trust in Your merciful heart. I am waiting patiently for Your word, Lord (1138) page 419

Today, the Corpus Christi procession took place. At the first altar, a flame issued from the Host and pierced my heart, and I heard a voice. **Here is My resting place.** Ardor burst into flame in my heart. I felt that I am transformed completely into Him. (1140) page 419

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
