The first month of the New Year is gone. On Tuesday, of this week, it will be the first day of February, that this year will have only 28 days. On Wednesday, of this week, we will observe the Presentation of the Lord to commemorate the historic event when Mary and Joseph took baby Jesus to Jerusalem to the Temple and presented Him to God. At the same time, Mary in obedience to the Jewish Law fulfilled her ritual to be purified 40 days after the birth of her son. During this event Simon took the baby Jesus into his hands and said the words that shocked Mary. He told her of the actual historical situation in which Jesus is to accomplish his mission in misunderstanding and sorrow. We all know how the life of Jesus ended. Upon hearing this prophesy, Mary had in her mind and heart feelings of sorrow, that eventually led the Church to give her the title Our Lady of Sorrow. During the Mass the candles will be blessed for personal use at home.

On February 3rd, the Feast of St. Blaise, we will have Mass at noon with touchless Blessing of the Throats to follow.

On Friday, February 4th there will be First Friday beginning at 8:30 a.m. with Confession, Mass at 9 a.m. and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to follow.

On First Saturday, Feb 5th there will be Confession at 10:30 a.m. followed by the Mass in expiation for wrong doing and sins of the world. In the year 1917 the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared in Fatima asking people to work and live in such a way that the weight of goodness and kindness will overcome the weight of evil in our culture. Please come join us for this devotion.

Please join us here at St. Faustina every First Saturday of the month as we fulfill the First Saturday request.

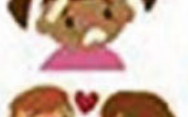

The Ten Commandments are essentially a summary of the 613 commandments contained in the Old Testament Law. The first four commandments deal with our relationship with God. The last six commandments deal with our relationships with one another. The Ten Commandments are recorded in the Bible in Exodus 20:1-17 and Deuteronomy 5:6-21 and are as follows:

		
	1	Love God more than anything else.
	2	Don't make anything more important than God.
	3	Always say God's name with love and respect.
	4	Honor the Lord by resting on the seventh day of the week.
	5	Love and respect your mom and dad.
	6	Never hurt anyone.
	7	Always be faithful to your husband or wife.
	8	Don't take anything that isn't yours.
	9	Always tell the truth.
	10	Be happy with what you have. Don't wish for other people's things.

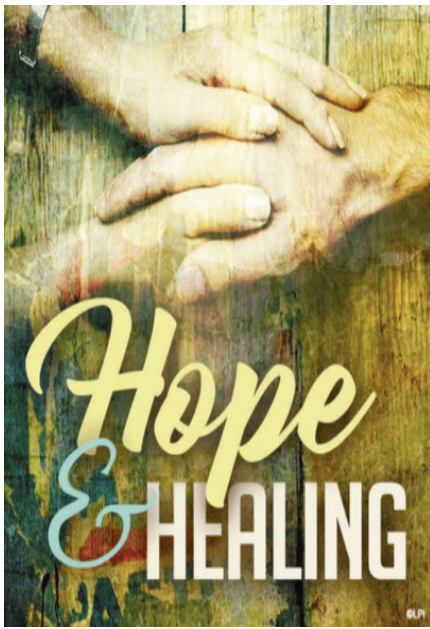
