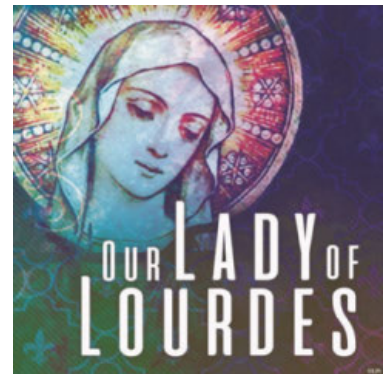

On Wednesday, February 2nd we observed the Presentation of the Lord. Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple. **Luke 2:22** tells us: "When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord...." Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem forty days after he was born and according to the Law of Moses, they presented him to the Lord.



This week the readings Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8 and 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

We have learned that the Holy Spirit guides us to be good, caring people and follow Gods Commandments. In this week's readings, they confirm we are forgiven for our sins. To truly be forgiven is to be sorry and not continue to make the same mistake. To truly and full heartedly be sorry and ask for forgiveness is to not repeat the sin.

Moses presented the Ten Commandments, after receiving them from God to the people. We have learned in our classes the different types of Sin.

The Commandments and God's Covenant: I am the Lord your God. You shall not have other gods besides me. (God loves us and promises to be present in our lives. We make promises to our friends and family to show them how important they are to us. When we keep our promises, we make others happy). God is happy when you keep your promises to Him.

1st, 2nd, and 3rd Commandments: The first commandment teaches us to put God first in our lives and to love and serve Him as the one true God. At church or in our homes, we may have sacred images, statues or pictures of God, Mary, the saints to help us pray. We treat these sacred images with respect and care. However, we do not worship them. We worship only God. In the second commandment, we are told to respect the name of God. This means that we never say the name of God or Jesus in anger. The third commandment says that we should keep holy the Sabbath day. Because of this, we set aside an entire day to honor God, beginning the day in church.

4th Commandment: Honor your father and mother. (We love, honor, respect, and obey our parents and all adults who care for us.

5th Commandment: You shall not kill. God gives us the gift of life. We must protect and defend the lives of unborn children the sick, and the elderly. We respect the life and health of others.

6th Commandment: You shall not commit adultery. God created man and woman in his divine image. God calls each to accept his or her identity. The Church teaches that the practice of chastity. We must respect our bodies and the bodies of others. We honor the lifelong bond of marriage.

7th Commandment: You shall not steal: We never take what does not belong to us nor cheat.

8th Commandment: You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor: We must not tell lies or mislead others; we must not hurt others by what we say.

9th Commandment: You shall not covet your neighbor's wife: We respect the promises married people have made to each other. We never dress or act in a way that could distract them from their commitment.

10th Commandment: You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor: We are satisfied with what we have. We are not jealous, envious, or greedy. The Gospel teaches us to place God first in our lives before all things.

Overflow Homeless Program Continues for 2022

Like last year MCREST (Macomb County Rotating Emergency Shelter) will be operating the *Overflow Homeless Program*. Guests are staying in a local motel which has been funded by a grant.

Churches who were a part of the previous program have been asked again to provide a bagged lunch for the OHP guests. This can be up to 120 guests, including men, women and children. Lunches will be delivered daily to the MCREST office. Guests are required to check-in daily and in doing so are given their lunch for the following day.

We will be providing a bagged lunch the week of March 13 – 19. We will continue to use funds that were collected in 2020 for part of this effort. Additional items will be requested using tags, similar to what was used for our Christmas boards.

In the weeks to come more information will be provided for volunteering March 13 - 19. There will be three individuals in the kitchen. With two resources outside the kitchen packing the lunches. Another resource will deliver the lunches each day by 1:00 p.m.

Our Christian Service commission looks forward to the continued generosity of our parish. And the many blessings donators and volunteers will receive for being a part of this mission.

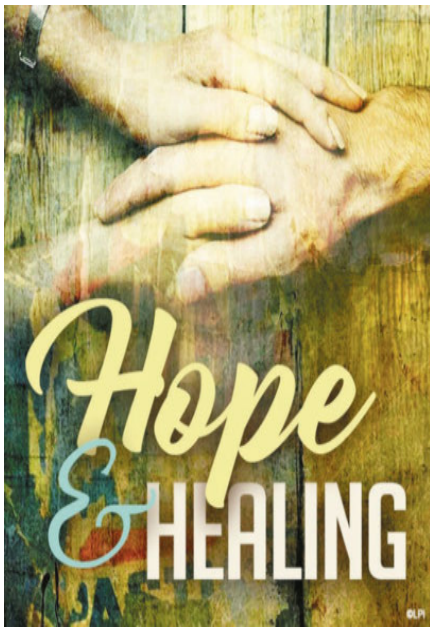
