

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are approaching another school year for Faith Formation Classes. Our 1^{st} – 8^{th} grade student classes begin Monday, September 26, 2022, from 6:00-7:15PM. Our 9^{th} grade students preparing for Sacrament of Confirmation will meet from 7:30-8:45. The first evening of class we like to have all students and at least one parent to welcome everyone with a short informational meeting. Students will then be dismissed to meet their teacher. We welcome children from families of other surrounding parishes, Children are our future in Christ.

Please find other information in the Church bulletins, and our website: stfaustinawarren.org. You may schedule an appointment to register your child(ren). I am flexible. Realizing most parent's work, I am open to meeting in the evening and or a time and date that works for you. I am not available on Fridays; my goal is to make it easier for you.

The cost this year will stay the same as last year. Tuition is as follows:

\$80.00 for 1 child \$100.00 for 2 children or more \$75.00 (Confirmation) \$15.00 Fee for Sacraments

We will be welcoming our students for face-to-face learning with continued safety protocol in place. We will issue individual supplies again this year that will be used only by your child. As of right now masks will not be required and the decision will be the choice of the parents. Also, if your child is ill, please keep them home. If a family member has Covid or if exposed to the COVID virus please report it to the Religious Education office, stfaustinadre@comcast.net or call Lynn McKnight, DRE 586-773-9220 ext. 111. We will collaborate with you during this time that your child will be out of class, to get their work to you. Please know that confidentiality is important to us, and we will not disclose any information about you, your child or family. We will be following the guidelines put forth by the Archdiocese of Detroit and the CDC, and we will make any changes necessary as the year progresses.

We will be locking the doors promptly at 6:05 p.m. the evenings of classes, they will remain locked until the end of class. If you are running late please ring the doorbell and we will come let you in. The teaching staff and I are excited to work with your children. Enjoy the rest of your summer and stay safe.

Then he said,

"A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.'

So the father divided the property between them.

After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country

where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation.

When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country,
