## Father Bogdan's Corner

After spending some time with them and their teachers I went to the other group of parishioners—adults who every evening in October are saying the Rosary and Chaplet of Divine Mercy. It was very inspiring and meditative prayer. We have to be thankful to them for praying for our intentions, the Church, the world and for peace in Ukraine.

Now it is time to think and pray for our predecessors. They are our mothers, fathers, relatives and friends. November 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> are a great occasion to be connected with them through prayer. November 1st is All Saints Day - a Holy Day of Obligation during which we commemorate people in heaven, who lived heroically virtuous lives, offered their life for others, or were martyred for faith, and are worthy of imitation. These are saints who are canonized and they have a special day of the year in the liturgical calendar. There are saints also who do not have the Church's public recognition but make up "Communion of Saints". They are ordinary people who were faithful to their role on earth. During their lives they placed their hope in Jesus and through Baptism, are his adopted sons and daughters. We remember them. There will be two Masses on that day at 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. Please join us.

On November 2<sup>nd</sup> during the Masses at 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. we will offer prayers of intercessions for the poor souls in purgatory who are waiting to join the Communion of Saints. These two days are an occasion for us to reflect on life after death. Please join us for the prayers on these days. I am asking all the altar servers to cover these Masses.

Please remember this week we also have First Friday Devotion and First Saturday Devotion. During these devotions, you can offer your prayers for the deceased members of your family.

Remember before all these dates we observe Halloween. There will be no Religious Education classes. I wish all of you a safe day.


