Father Bogdan's Corner

At the end of June, bishops, priests, deacons and lay people, from the Archdiocese of Detroit, attended a seminar entitled Missionary Renewal Assembly. There were great panelists, authors of books and speakers on the subject of Missions. From the beginning of Christianity, we are on a mission. This mission, of making faith the foundation of our lives, had continued through the first and second millennium. At the beginning of the third millennium, that we now live in, there is an urgency, not only for the priests but above all for laity, to be involved in the mission. In the past, we heard about evangelization, later on re-evangelization. Today we all must be sent on a mission to reset our lives around Jesus Christ. It means that Jesus', values and virtues must be placed in the center of our lives: families, institutions, and events. But all of us, it doesn't matter how different we are, must be in communion with one another. Unity comes from relationships, from shared goods, from shared places and prayers. Our relationship is built on holiness. We as a parish of St. Faustina, are in transition to become a part of the Family of Parishes (FoP) . It is time for us to ask: Whom we want to become? SVdP PANTRY UPDATE



In June, we served 119 individuals with food. This month we are asking for Bread & Butter pickles, cereal, hearty soups, tomato soup, canned ravioli, tuna, canned salmon, canned chicken, rice, rice sides, ramen noodles, manwich, canned mixed vegetables, jam, peanut butter, canned fruit, snack pack pudding, toilet tissue, dish soap, and laundry detergent. We are so very grateful for your donations and continued support.

Thank You for Supporting SVdP

In our second quarter of 2023 we continued to see many neighbors-in-need (NIN). As Vincentians of St Vincent de Paul we visit with each of our NIN ideally in their home or in our office. We start with prayer. They need not be Catholic but praying together sets a tone of calm to begin our discussion on their need(s).

This quarter we provided \$2,100 for rent assistance to four NIN. We assisted with \$705 for Detroit Edison for two NIN. For one NIN we paid a \$114 water bill. In addition, we twinned (supported) other SVdP conferences for \$700. In turn, when we ask for twinning, we too are supported. Our third quarter will be critical as we have fully used the funding from the Warren Community Block Grant. When funding is available, we are reimbursed through the city for rent assistance. Your continued generosity supports us to help our NIN. We are also grateful to Fr. Bogdan allowing us space to operate within the church. Thank you all very much.

Catholic Holy Land Pilgrimage

Terra Sancta Pilgrimages, with Franciscan friar Fr. Alex Kratz, will be leading a Catholic Pilgrimage to the Holy Land (Jordan, Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Galilee) **November 28-December 12, 2023**. This life-changing 14-day experience of walking in Jesus' footsteps includes daily Mass & Rosary, biblical readings on site, time for prayer, spiritual guidance, and meeting local Christians. Cost is \$5,200 (all expenses included, round-trip from Detroit, 3 daily meals, all tips and taxes). Registration is first come, first serve. A mandatory **Orientation Meeting** for the registered is 2:00 pm Sunday, **August 27**, at St. Joseph Chapel (400 South Blvd. West, Pontiac, MI 48341). Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
