Dear Parents/Guardians:

It was a pleasure nurturing the Spiritual Growth of your child(ren) this past year.

We can not express enough the importance of their continued Spiritual nurturing and assisting you to bring our youth closer to Jesus, the Church and how our Faith will help guide them through their lives.

It is very important for your children to continue their Religious Education. We know how busy our lives can become so allow us to help you to build good Catholic knowledge and understanding for your children.

With each grade level a new set of curriculum is taught so that when our students reach a Sacramental year they are prepared. After First Holy Communion we begin to teach:

- Who is God, How is He made present through the Church.
- Why do our everyday actions matter.
- The Bible. What does the Bible teach us about Jesus' power to heal people? How can I talk to Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration about my own needs.
- What are the four marks (characteristics) of the Church? What do we believe as Catholic Christians?
- What do we know about Heaven, hell, purgatory, and the end of time?
- What do we know about the Most Holy Trinity?
- Why do we honor and pray to Jesus' mother?
- What and how to pray.
- Why is sin harmful? What are the types of sin and how does the devil try to turn us away from God?
- What is conversion?
- What are the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and why do disciples naturally want to do them?
- What is grace and what effect does grace have on my life?

And so much more.

There is just so much to be learned after our First Holy Communion to lead up to the Sacrament of Confirmation and adulthood.

In our lives today there are so many things that can sway our youth in the wrong direction. If we can build their Spiritual knowledge it will help to keep them from making the wrong choices along their journey through life.

I cannot express enough the importance to make sure you register your children in Religious Education classes.

Protecting God's Children (PGC)

Recertification is required for all existing volunteers and employees who completed Protecting God's Children (PGC) before January 1, 2020. Recertification must be completed by November 1, 2023. If you did not receive an email about your recertification, log into your existing Virtus account at www.virtus.org - you should not create a new account if you have taken Protecting God's Children in the past. If you do not remember your username or password or if you have difficulties accessing your account, or have further questions contact the parish office at (586) 772-2720. Once you have logged into your Virtus account you should see the assigned training under the Home tab / Current Training. The self-paced modules (Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults) are entirely online and take approximately 2.5 hours to complete. You can stop and start as you need to complete training at your convenience. Yearly background checks are also required.

If you have never taken the training before, log into www.virtus.org and create an account. Follow the prompts given and register for a session. If you plan to volunteer for something in the future, now is a good time to begin the process.

Report Abuse

Registration

Parishioners may register in person, by phone, or online.

Baptism

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. For more information call the Parish Office.

Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
