Father Bogdan's Corner

Welcome to the new Liturgical Season—Advent. This year Advent will be very short because on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, after the 11 a.m. Mass, it will be time to celebrate Christmas. In our parish the Nativity of the Lord Celebration will begin with 4 p.m. High Mass. Traditionally, it is the best attended Mass for several reasons: it is the family Mass, it is the children's Mass, it is a good time for teens and for all of us because after the Mass we can go to the restaurants and continue to celebrate the Birth of Christ. You do not need to make reservations for the Mass because our church can accommodate up to one-thousand people, but I am encouraging you to make reservations at the restaurant after the 4 p.m. Mass. How nice it would be if the restaurants on Christmas Eve night would give all customers 5 or 10% discount. The owners would be blessed for the whole year.

But to experience all the blessings dispensed to us on Christmas we have to prepare ourselves. God is taking one step—we have to make another. What I mean by our step: For three weeks of Advent be focused on the light—Christ is the Light that comes from our churches. It is during the consecration that Christ is born. Let us come and adore Him. What you should do: Watch AoD web page where Archbishop, bishops, priests, and lay ministers are sharing or instructing us about the spirit of Christmas. I know that you do not want to miss that spirit. It will be a big loss for the whole year.

In our parish we offer you every Friday at 8:30 a.m. and on Saturday at 3 p.m. Sacrament of Reconciliation. On Thursday's during Advent at 6:00 p.m. Holy Hour with the Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. On December 14th at 12 noon an "Advent Gathering" with lunch, speaker and singing, that will be open to all men & women.

On Friday, December 8th, on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, Mass will be at 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. During the evening Mass, there will be blessing of the Christmas lights outside as a sign of our readiness from the outside. Inside of ourselves, preparation must continue until December 24th.

ADVENT

The Liturgical Season of Advent marks the time of Spiritual preparation by the faithful before Christmas, extending over the four Sundays before Christmas. The word *Advent* from the Latin *advenio*, "to come to, "and refers to the coming of Christ. And the term *the coming* includes three references: first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; second, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to His second coming at the end of time.

Our preparations, therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to receive Christ worthily.

Advent begins Sunday, December 3 and ends Monday, December 25th. We are giving you some ideas to do as a family as we prepare for the celebration of Jesus Christs Birthday, Christmas.



THINGS YOU CAN DO AS A FAMILY

Sunday 12/03: Prepare an Advent wreath: three purple candles, one pink candle, and some evergreens. Place all on a tray or large plate. The candles can symbolize Hope, Faith, Joy, and Peace. Light the first purple candle and pray to God about the things you hope for.

Monday, **12/04**: Make a nativity scene with household materials. Paint paper tubes to make the Holy Family. Use bits of fabric to make clothes. Use a shoebox to make the barn and a small box for the manger. Wait for Christmas Day to put Jesus in the manger.

Tuesday, 12/05: The Christmas story begins with one small family set to change the world. On yellow strips of paper, write ways that your family can help bring light and hope to your community during Advent. Keep the papers in a jar. As you complete these actions, place them in the nativity scene you made to act as hay.

Wednesday, **12/06**: Feast of Saint Nicholas: Listen to a story about the legendary gift giver. Make or buy a small, thoughtful gift for someone you know. A Polish custom was that the children put there shoes outside of their bedroom and Saint Nicholas would come and leave them a small token.

Thursday, **12/07**: Mary and Joseph were immigrants traveling far from their home when Jesus was born. Try sleeping in a different place in your house tonight. Swap beds with a sibling or sleep in a sleeping bag on the floor. Thank God for the comforts of your home.

Friday, **12/08**: Feast of the Immaculate Conception: Honor Mary, Mother of God by praying the Hail Mary today. Mary is Jesus' mother. Take special care of your mother or a mother figure I your life today.

Saturday, 12/09: Feast of Saint Juan Diego: Juan Diego lived in Mexico, and Mary appeared to him. Eat a Mexican meal today and pray the Hail Mary before your meal in honor of Saint Juan Diego's devotion to Mary.

Join us for an Advent Gathering on December 14th at 12:00 p.m. Sandwiches along with homemade cookies will be on the menu. Tickets will be \$15.00. Get your tickets early for an afternoon of socializing and an inspirational talk to prepare us for the Birth of Christ.

Our Guest Speaker will be Mrs. Lisa Rajnicek, M.Ed., MAPS. Lisa is the Director of Discipleship Formation – North Macomb Family #1 and Director of Continuing Religious Education – St. Lawrence Parish.

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.


