But we need enough rest. During the night when we sleep, our body is rejuvenated, our immune system is strengthened and we get a good rest. We need to be restful for the coming days. Today, we celebrate St. Patrick's Day. We have many parishioners who have beautiful Irish roots. May God through the intercession of St. Patrick bless us all. On Tuesday, March 19, there will be the feast day of St. Joseph, beloved spouse of Mary and carpenter who created a home for God's Son Jesus. We will have Mass at 9 a.m. with the blessing of bread. We need rest and peace of mind and heart for the celebrations of Palm Sunday next weekend and the observance of the Holy Week. On Palm Sunday, that is known as Passion Sunday, we will commemorate Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, the Capital of Israel. There Jesus was welcomed. A few days later He was rejected and condemned to death. The main readings for that Sunday will be the Passion, the long gospel that describes the final days and hours of Jesus' life in human flesh on the earth. Palms will be blessed too. 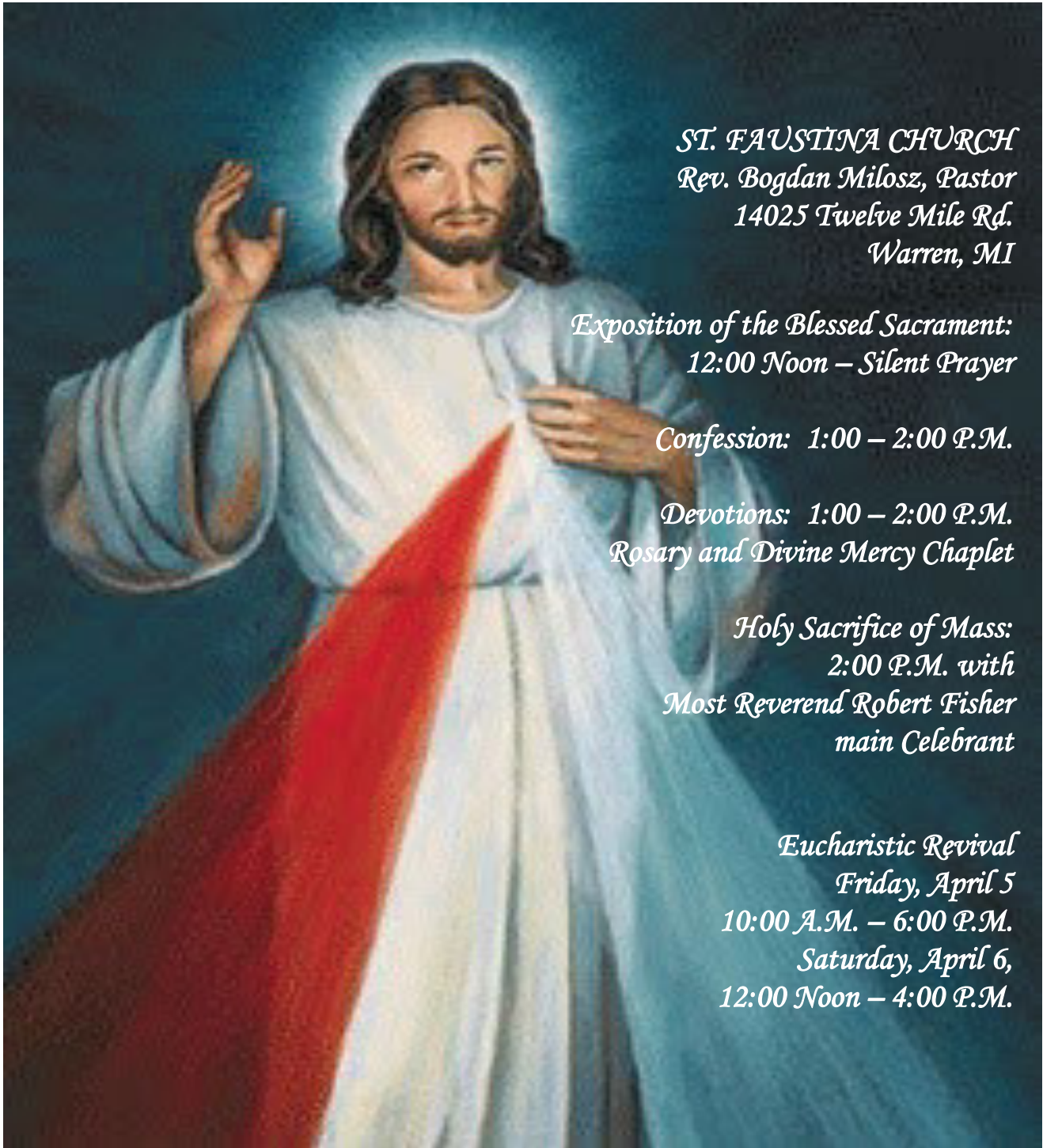

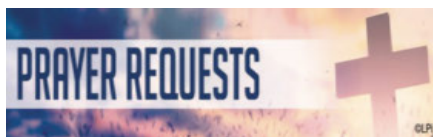

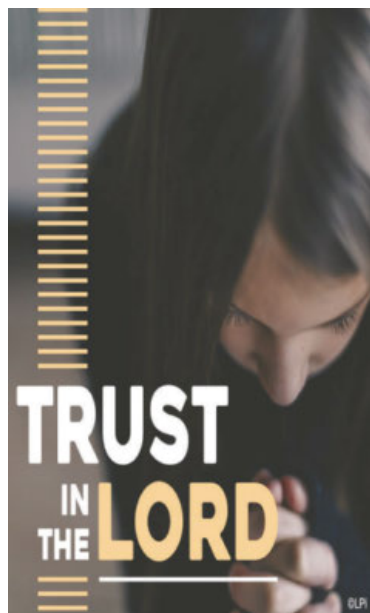

Registration

Baptism

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. For more information call the Parish Office.

Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.

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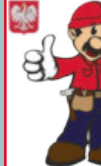
