With observing Palm Sunday and receiving blessed branches, we entered into the Most Holiest week of the Liturgical Year, commencing with the Passion and concluding with Holy Saturday. During this week, we will commemorate in a special way, through the triduum liturgies God's redeeming act of Passion and Resurrection. Colored with sorrow, the ceremonies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday express gratitude to the Lord for His mercy in becoming man to suffer and die for us. During this Holy Week, especially during Holy Thursday at 7 p.m., Good Friday at 2:00 p.m. and Holy Saturday at 8:00 p.m., many liturgical rites will be observed. Through them, we will relive the occurrences at the end of Christ life, in and which we celebrate the Pascal Mystery whereby Jesus reconciled the world to His Father. During these days there will be many devotions: Holy Masses, Stations of the Cross, Adoration of Jesus' Tomb, rosary, chaplets, private prayer, blessing of the food for your Easter table, and veneration of the cross. Please be advised that these devotions are only an addition to the official Liturgies of the Church. The Official Liturgies of the Church are Thursday at 7:00 p.m., Good Friday a 2:00 p.m. and Easter Vigil with Sacraments of Initiation and Exultet by Matthew at 8:00 p.m. For instance, blessing of the food for Easter is not the fulfillment of your Easter obligation or the Rosary on Good Friday is not your fulfillment of Good Friday's meaningful and official Liturgy that will dispense all the blessings on us. May the Good Lord provide you with hunger and thirst for graces of the Holy Triduum.



Gospel - Blessing of the Palms Jn 12:12-16

When the great crowd that had come to the feast heard

that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they took palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out:

"Hosanna!

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord,

the king of Israel."

Jesus found an ass and sat upon it, as is written: Fear no more, O daughter Zion;

see, your king comes, seated upon an ass's colt. But you, O LORD, be not far from me; His disciples did not understand this at first, but when Jesus had been glorified they remembered that these things were written about him and that they had done this for him.






