Father Bogdan's Corner

Happy Easter to our parishioners and guests. Easter is the oldest and most solemn Catholic Solemnity during the Liturgical Year. It is also called the Pasch after the Jewish feast commencing the emancipation of the Jews from their servitude in Egypt. It was in His last celebration of the Passover on first Holy Thursday that Christ instituted the Eucharist, and the priesthood of the New Law. The deliverance of the Jews foreshadowed the Catholic Pasch, when Christ the Lamb was sacrificed that the human race would be liberated from the bondage of the devil. Thus Easter that we celebrate today is the Catholic Passover. We commemorate and celebrate Jesus' resurrection and to some degree our resurrection to a new life. On Ash Wednesday we heard: "Repent & Believe in the Gospel" so today after our Lenten re-set we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus who died for us and rose to be with us. We have to appreciate His Resurrection and enjoy the fact that we are redeemed and free to do God's will. Jesus' death on the cross and His Resurrection is a sign of God's love and mercy upon followers of Resurrected Jesus.

Next weekend April 7th, we will observe with the entire Catholic Church Divine Mercy Sunday to express gratitude to God for His mercy upon us who live in an imperfect world. Please join us for devotions that will start at 12 noon, 1 p.m. Confession for those who need it, and 2 p.m. Mass by Bishop Robert Fisher. All attendees will receive a special gift to remember St. Faustina for promoting Divine Mercy. Also, I am asking you to participate in the Eucharistic Adoration on Friday April 5th from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and on Saturday April 6th from 12 noon to 4 p.m.



he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.


When Simon Peter arrived after him,
