Father Bogdan's Corner

For 11 years we are gathering on the First Sunday after Easter for the observance of the Divine Mercy Sunday. The main reason is that Jesus wanted this Feast to be established in order to “throw a lifeline” to souls who are perishing, souls who are drowning in sin and despair. That lifeline is this Feast, with all the tremendous promises of graces and benefits which Jesus attached to it. St. Faustina, the Patroness of our Parish, was born in Poland and belonged to the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. Bibliographers are stressing that she was uneducated and poor. She did not have a formal education but she was a woman with common sense and full of knowledge that came directly from contemplation of God. The knowledge that we are provided through formal education is not complete. It is only our interpretation of God's knowledge. Scholars and educators through all kinds of tests, observations and analysis tried to present us with hypothesis, theories and explanations. They are very helpful to us to understand the mystery of God's operation in the history of humanity. Sister Faustina had direct knowledge from God through Jesus Christ. Her knowledge and understanding that she shared with us in her diary helped many people in their struggles in life. She received the knowledge from God through contemplation. In this noisy world, full of hypothesis and often contradicted theories, let us try to contemplate the Mystery of God. Today, on Divine Mercy Sunday, let us contemplate the Mystery of God's Mercy.

Welcome Bishop Fisher and my brother priests, deacons and you parishioners and guests for this wonderful Celebration of God's Love and Mercy. May St. Faustina intercede for us in obtaining God's Mercy.

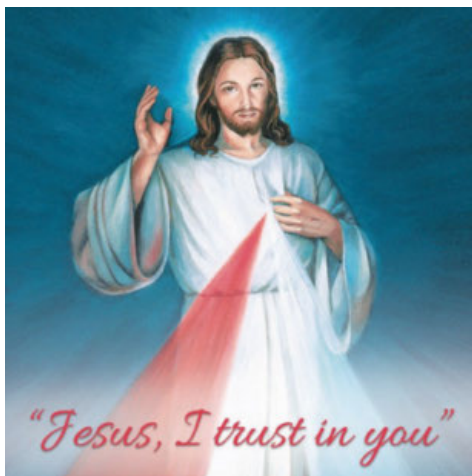

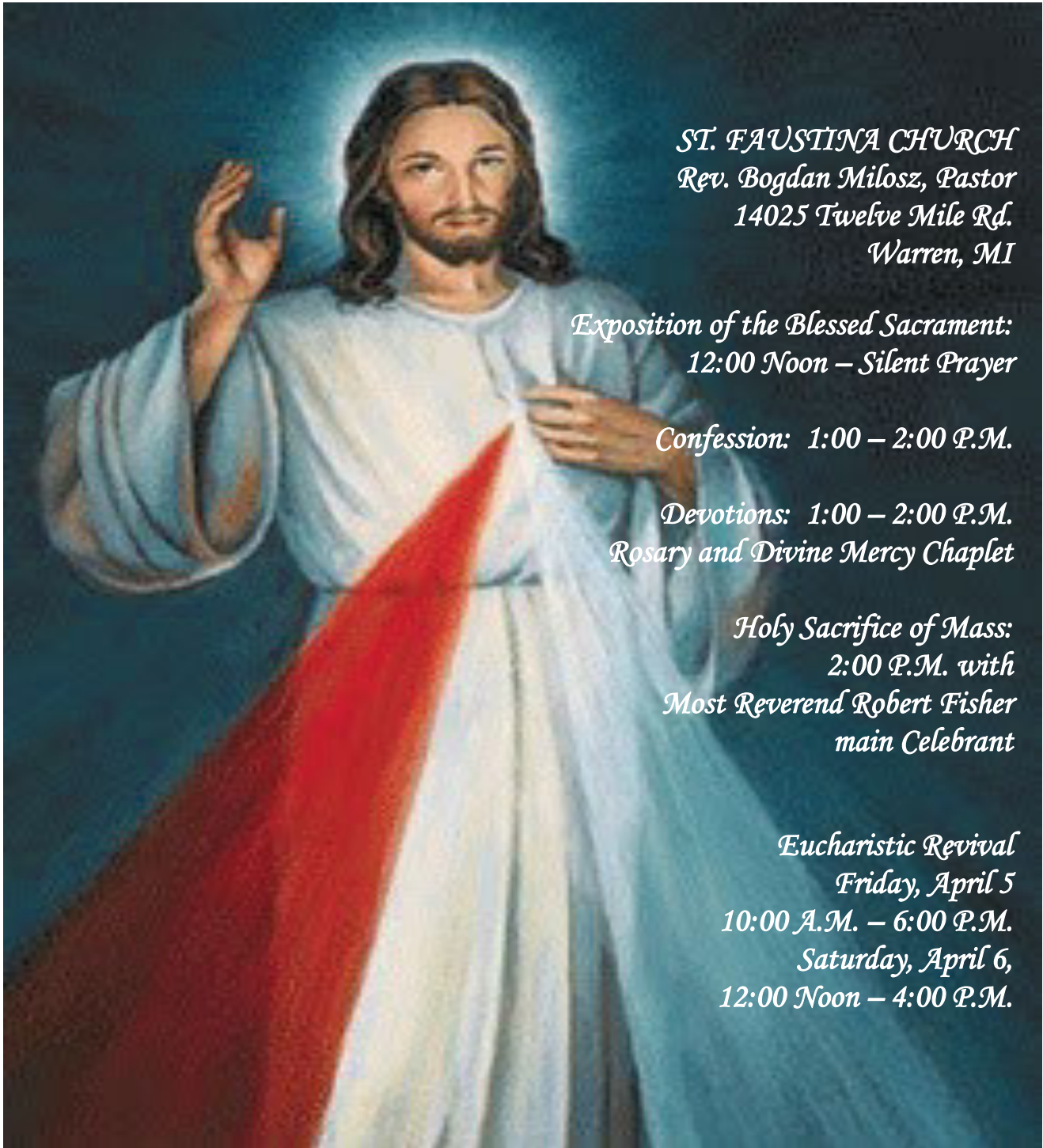

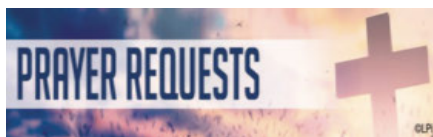
