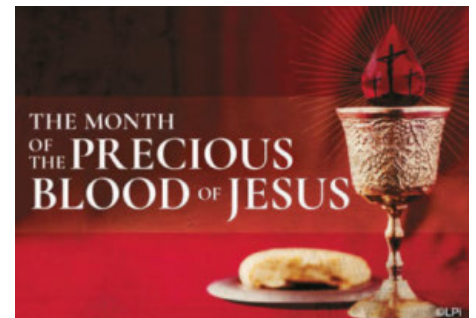

Beginning the Liturgy of the Eucharist

Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Holy, Holy, Holy, Sanctus

(In the Sanctus prayer at Mass we look up in unity with the angels and saints to heaven (holy, holy, holy) and look down to earth where we need Christ's salvation (hosanna means "save us")

Mystery of Faith

The Doxology and the Great Amen (During the doxology, the priest speaks of Christ saying "through him, and with him, and in him." This is the way we should live our entire lives, not just while praying at Mass.)

This Is My Body, This Is My Blood

"Amen" means "I believe." During the Mass this amen is often called the Great Amen. What is the one, most important thing you believe about Christ?

The Sign of Peace

As a Family discuss THE SIGN OF PEACE: At Mass we get the chance to make peace with the people around us. Who else needs your peace? Write their names and something you could ask them to forgive of you or that you can forgive of the

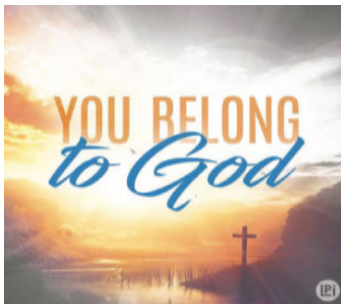

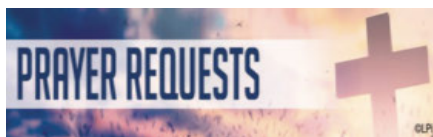

Registration

Baptism

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. For more information call the Parish Office.

Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
