Father Bogdan's Corner

The Eucharistic Congress that we read and heard about ends this weekend. Each day of the Congress was packed with opportunities for personal transformation and life - giving Catholic Community. Our Archbishop, Allen Vigneron, had a Holy Mass on Wednesday, July 19th at the Cathedral of SS Peter & Paul in Indianapolis where many lay people, religious, priests and bishops were participating. I hope that those who followed the Congress on the media benefited from it. What benefit should we expect? The answer is: The Eucharistic Revival. It requires more time for Adoration of Christ in the Eucharist. We lose our sense of Eucharistic community, intimacy with Christ and have been placed in the culture of technology. The Eucharistic Jesus is far away from us. Give Him and yourself the opportunity to grow in the relationship with Jesus and through Him and with Him in relationship with humanity. Be motivated by the efforts that was made to prepare the Congress and give more time to the Eucharistic Jesus. You my parishioners be inspired to spend more time with the Eucharist. In our church, we have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on First Friday and First Saturday of each month. The Sacrifice of the Mass is the highest form of adoration because it commemorates the greatest act of adoration by which Jesus gave Himself to God the Father.
