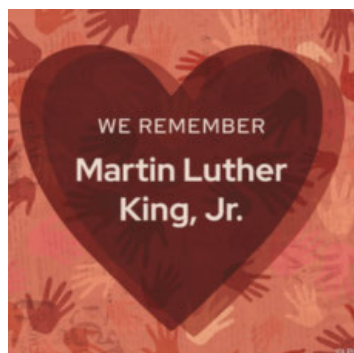

JUBILEE YEAR 2025

You may have heard Father Bogdan, your parents, grandparent's aunts and uncles talking about the Jubilee Year.

The Jubilee Year began on December 24th when Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and brings forth the Ordinary Jubilee of the Year 2025. Since 1300, Jubilee celebrations have marked not only the passing of years and centuries but has also served as holy times in human history when we pause, pray, seek the Lord's pardon, and praise Him for His merciful grace. As instructed by God in the Old Testament he told the children of Israel through Moses to count every 25 years as sacred.

The theme for the 2025 Jubilee is "Pilgrims of Hope."

Our students will be learning about the Jubilee year in class, parents please discuss and help students with further understanding by doing some or all as a family listed below.

- ♦ Plan a virtual Pilgrimage: go on youtube and visit and learn about places like
 - The Basilica, Isreal, Father Solanus Center, Shrines, Divine Mercy Center

Visit the sites once a month so that the students and your families learn a lot about these places.

- ♦ REFLECT AND PRAY: Set a time each evening for family prayer time.
- ♦ MASS: Attend Church as a family, Saturday's at 4:00 or Sunday's 8:30 a.m. or 11:00 a.m.

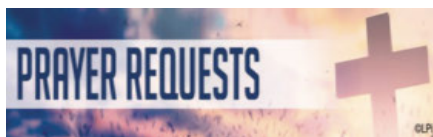

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. For more information call the Parish Office.

Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
