Sunday, May 5th our students made their third Sacrament, the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, or Holy Communion.

Sacraments are signs of God's love and presence. This Sacrament is called the Blessed Sacrament because it is the most blessed of all the Sacraments since it is Jesus Christ Himself.

The Holy Eucharist is the Sacrament in which Jesus is physically present under the appearances of the Bread is His body and the wine is His Precious Blood.

Like Jesus' disciples during the Last Supper, you have received the Eucharist for the first time. When we receive the Eucharist in Holy Communion, we become closer to Jesus and the Church. This helps us act and love as Jesus did.

First Reading: Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga
and reached Antioch in Pisidia.
On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took
their seats.
Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism
followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them
and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God.
On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered
to hear the word of the Lord.
When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with
jealousy
and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said.
Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said,
“It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to
you first,
but since you reject it
and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life,
we now turn to the Gentiles.

First Reading (Cont'd)

For so the Lord has commanded us,
*I have made you a light to the Gentiles,
that you may be an instrument of salvation
to the ends of the earth.*”

The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this
and glorified the word of the Lord.
All who were destined for eternal life came to believe,
and the word of the Lord continued to spread
through the whole region.
The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence
who were worshipers
and the leading men of the city,
stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas,
and expelled them from their territory.
So they shook the dust from their feet in protest
against them,
and went to Iconium.
The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

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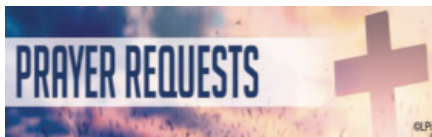

Registration

Parishioners may register in person, by phone, or online.

Baptism

At least one parent needs to be registered, active and a practicing Catholic for at least six months. A Baptismal Preparation Class is required for both parents and godparents. The church requires that at least one of the godparents be an active and practicing Catholic. For more information call the Parish Office.

Marriages

Arrange at least six months in advance.

Communion Calls

Pastoral Staff members visit the sick in the hospital when possible and take Communion to the sick and homebound regularly. Names of the sick should be reported to the Parish Office.
