



SVdP 2nd Quarter Recap

Here's a recap of the work we were able to accomplish with your donations. Five families were supported with a combined \$2,300 for rent assistance. One single mom was helped with a water bill for \$317.71. Beds were purchased for two seniors who attend our monthly pantry. An online store, Malouf, has a relationship with SVdP and provides mattresses and frames at a greatly reduced rate. These two mattresses, a queen and twin were purchased for \$295. Lastly, we supplemented your pantry donations with a purchase from Gleaners for \$432. We continue to appreciate your support and prayers for our work, it is not possible without you, thank you.
