Father Bogdan's Corner


It is the last weekend of September and on Saturday it was the memorial of St. Vincent de Paul. He is the patron of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Society that is preventing homelessness, fighting hunger and changing lives of many people. Thank you to all volunteers and donors to their society.

Since this is the last Sunday of September we will observe First Friday and First Saturday of October this week. Traditionally the month of October is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and we say the rosary. There are four mysteries of the Rosary: Glorious, Joyful, Luminous and Sorrowful. I am very glad that our prayer group is saying the Rosary before each Mass, and having a special devotion on Thursdays.

October 4th is the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi and at 1 p.m. we will have the blessing of animals who today are considered "good companions" for many people.

Next Sunday, October 5th is the Feast Day dedicated to St. Faustina, the patroness of our parish that was established on July 1, 2013. - 3. Complete your Virtus Protecting God's Children training session—in-person and online options available. You must preregister for training.
- St. Faustina will be hosting a session on October 9th from 6:00 -9:00 p.m. It will be held here in the Family Center. If you haven't had the training yet or are due to renew your training sign up now with the above information.
