It is a religious order for men that follow the rules of St. Benedict. These monks conduct contemplative life that is to be focused completely on God. Twenty-four hours a day they live in complete union with God. Work and prayers are their stigma. Their lives, like ours, go through changes and adjustments. Years ago they worked on a farm. Today, they adapted to a new way of supporting themselves. They are in possession of a huge woods and now they are making caskets. BY GRACE YOU HAVE BEEN SAVED

Read as a family Ephesians 2:4-10. Pick a memorable word or phrase that jumps out at you as you read this passage and write it below.

Definition of Grace

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines grace as “the free and underserved help that God gives us to respond to His call to become children of God.”

CCC1996: Our justification comes from the grace of God. Grace is favor, the free and undeserved help that God gives us to respond to his call to become children of God, adoptive sons, partakers of the divine nature and of eternal life. (“an habitual Gift”)

CCC2000: Sanctifying grace is an habitual gift, a stable and supernatural disposition that perfects the soul itself to enable it to live with God, to act by his love. Habitual grace, the permanent disposition to live and act in keeping with God's call, is distinguished from actual graces which refer to God's interventions, whether at the beginning of conversion or in the course of the work of sanctification. (and “the Gift of the Holy Spirit”)

CCC2003: Grace is first and foremost the gift of the Spirit who justifies and sanctifies us. But grace also includes the gifts that the Spirit grants us to associate us with his work, to enable us to collaborate in the salvation of others and in the growth of the Body of Christ, the Church. There are sacramental graces, gifts proper to the different sacraments. There are furthermore special graces, also called charisms after the Greek term used by St. Paul and meaning “favor,” “gratuitous gift,” “benefit.” Whatever their character - sometimes it is extraordinary, such as the gift of miracles or of tongues - charisms are oriented toward sanctifying grace and are intended for the common good of the Church. They are at the service of charity which builds up the Church.
