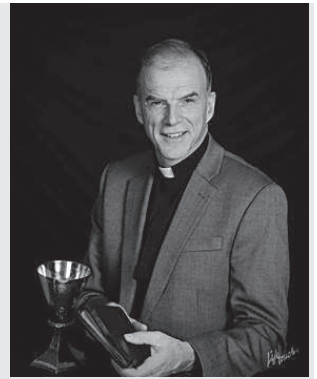

Dear People of Holy Family, St. Mary and St. Anthony Parish:

“...anyone who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple.”

(Luke 14:33)

On the last Sunday of August the whole world turns Slovenian! Or at least more than 600 did. Between dine in and dine out there were well over six hundred people who came to enjoy the good food and fellowship at the Holy Family Bazaar. Despite all of the visitors, the locals came out pretty well with parish member Frank Pekol winning the grand prize in the cash raffle and St. Mary member Bill Sladich winning the Cross Bow in the bucket raffle. But all had a marvelous time.



Such a successful event takes months of planning and then an army of people to make it all happen the days leading up to the Bazaar. Isn't it amazing that all those Holy Family parish members received no pay. Even the prizes were donated. There was no personal gain involved. They did it for The Lord. It's all His. As radical as today's Gospel is, there are people all around us who practice it. They have renounced their possessions to be His disciples.

With such gifts from Holy Family parish members a new sound system is going in this week at Holy Family. All new speakers, microphones, receivers and transmitters will be installed. In addition to improved sound in the Church we will have built in amplified sound in the hall as well. Thank you Bob Trunkel for the research and technical support on this project and thank you to all who renounced possessions to make this possible!

How good to see our schools bustling with life again. Welcome back all students and teachers! We've missed you over the summer. St. Mary's school began with twenty-seven students, six more than last year and a very experienced faculty. With new Smart Boards in all the classrooms and laptops in the older grades a new world of learning is opening up. The only way to improve things for this new year would be to find one more person willing to provide music at the school liturgies. Without Seth Duprey on staff we have only one student from the school available to play. If there is anyone out there who'd be willing to play a couple of times a month on a Thursday morning, please renounce all other engagements and call Mrs. Raycher!

St. Anthony's began the year with thirty-two students, also six more than last year. But the new feel at St. Anthony's this year is the presence of the younger children in the Child Care program. Their numbers were in flux as this letter was being written. The Child Care parents who came to the open house said there is lots of conversation going on in town among parents with children. They felt once people see the Child Care program actually up and running they'll feel confident about bringing their children.

This coming Wednesday Religious Education Classes begin again. Both St. Mary's and St. Anthony's evening classes will start with a bonfire, Rosary and refreshments. What a blessing to have a full roster of Catechists, including a Kindergarten teacher for St. Anthony's! I'm anxious for you to meet them all at our Catechetical Sunday Celebrations September 17 & 18 when we'll invite all teachers and catechists forward to renew their readiness to renounce much personal comfort in order to help our children become better disciples of Christ.

Our Vital Signs Confirmation Program has its first class on September 14th. But next Sunday, we will call forward all Confirmation Students (those in the 11th grade) at the 4:00pm, 8:30am and 10:30am Masses to receive their commitment to set aside the time this year to prepare for their being Confirmed December 4th at 1:00pm at St. Anthony's church.

And don't forget that we begin offering a Sunday evening liturgy at 7:30pm next Sunday at St. Anthony's in Loyal. We are working on developing a Youth Choir and welcome all voices and instruments. If you'd like to become a part of Sunday evening music ministry please contact Marnie Schecklman. We hope this time will be good both for farmers and for those coming back from weekends away. But in the end our faith will never really be convenient. The master said from the start: "unless you renounce all your possessions, you cannot be my disciple."

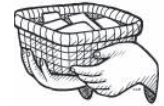

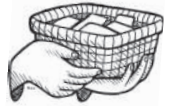
