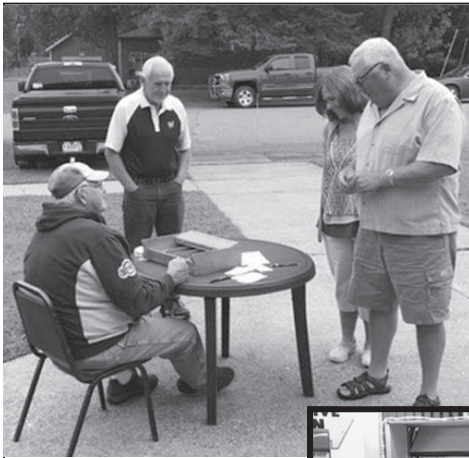

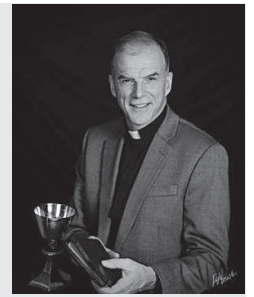

Dear People of St. Anthony, St. Mary and Holy Family Parish:

“What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world but lose his soul?”
(Matt. 16:26)



From Arizona, Minnesota, Milwaukee, Madison and all parts in between... people came to the Holy Family Parish Bazaar last Sunday. “We just had to come home” was the almost unanimous answer to the question: What brings you to Willard? The word “home” is very closely connected to “soul.” They both are a way of talking about being free to be your true self. Being far from home is distressing because it means being far from who you truly are. Yet the attraction of material things and the rush of life can carry us further and further away. Our Gospel question is a wake up call: What profit do you really gain if you make all the money in the world, but lose your soul in the process?

Many of the over 600 who ate the Bazaar raved about the chicken and ham dinner. The sell out of tickets for the raffle is evidence they really wanted to support Holy Family Parish. But clearly it was all of the long leisure conversations with family and old friends that was the real draw. Thank you Holy Family Parish for providing a time and place for people to come home and reconnect with their soul.

St. Mary's too has been working on the soul of their faith family as they update and renovate their parish home. When you think of the precious memories and sacred experiences people have had in the Church building you know to touch this building is to touch the hearts of this faith community. And to make it ready to be the spiritual home of families for the next 100 years is to nurture their souls.

As you see in this week's financial report, we have not only secured the funds for the new organ, but are closing in rapidly on the monies needed for phase II of the kitchen. Confident that we will gather the remaining funds needed in the next couple of weeks, the committee working on the kitchen is meeting this Tuesday to finalize the plans. Also, all are invited to come down after the 8:30am Mass today to see the new floor and stoves installed as Phase I of the campaign and to learn where the new dishwasher and sinks will go with Phase II.

Strengthening all of the parishes in the deanery is the purpose of this Wednesday's third annual Convocation. A good number of registrations have come in since last weekend. But we will still accept walk-ins. That is, even if you don't register in advance you are still welcome to come.

I need to correct a typo in my last week's bulletin letter. I raised some eyebrows in the part where I shared that the second most popular workshop was on Centering Prayer which is being led by Annie Lea. I wrote: “Annie moved into Greenwood recently with her husband Christine.” The correct spelling of her husband's name is “Christian.” Some were concerned we were offering a workshop by a person in a same sexed relationship. Annie's workshop this week is now the most people registered. So I am relieved my misspelling didn't affect too many people. The second most popular workshop now is the one on understanding the Church's teaching on same sexed relationships and guidance on how to speak with family members about this. Clearly something we can all benefit from.

Next Sunday, at the 8:30am and 10:30am liturgies we are “Enrolling our Confirmation Students.” We will call them forward and ask them to commit themselves to their final preparation for the Sacrament on December 3rd. And we will express to them our support. Pray with me that this will bind them more deeply into our faith family, make our parishes their home, and nurture their souls.

For the same reason we will be taking all evening Religious Ed students (7-10th grade) on retreat Sunday, September 24th. The 11:00am to 5:00pm retreat will be led by the National Evangelization Team. The day will be focused on growing authentic friendships. In the age of cyber-bullying, aggressive competition, and over-sexualization, growing real friendships is difficult. Pray with me that our youth learn how to be themselves and not lose their souls in this hectic world.

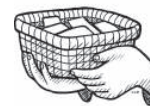
