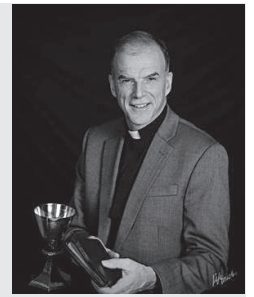

Dear People of Holy Family, St. Mary and St. Anthony Parish:

“For wherever two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.”
(Matt. 18:20)

It is all about gathering people in Christ’s name this week. On Wednesday our Religious Education programs begin. Thanks to very generous parents there will be a meal provided in St. Mary’s and St. Anthony’s Church Halls before class each week. Though at this first class the meal will be at the end of class, while everyone enjoys a campfire.



This Thursday the Religious Education Committee and the Family Life Committee are meeting together to resolve a difference over where we should go next with youth ministry. After the decision was made to not hire a full time coordinator of youth ministry and religious education, the Religious Ed. Committee met and felt that at St. Mary’s and Holy Family they were not ready to hire a part time person just for their two parishes with the funds available in the budget. They thought it would be better to use those funds directly for youth activities. The Family Life Committee also met and felt that to keep youth ministry growing at St. Mary’s & Holy Family they should use the funds that were set aside in the budget to hire a part time youth minister for the two parishes. So this Thursday the two committees will meet together to resolve which direction they will take.

St. Anthony’s committee members are also committed to keeping youth ministry growing. This past month the middle school and high school catechists met together and agreed that one Wednesday of the month the focus would be more on youth ministry than catechesis. They are planning to bring all the evening classes together in activities that are fun, community building and educational. In all three parishes our committee members and catechists are committed to bringing youth together in Christ’s name so they can experience Him there in the midst of them.

Sometimes you can have too much of a good thing, even if it is getting together in Christ’s name!! At our Sacred Worship Committee meeting August 31 we wrestled with the fact that Christmas this year is on a Monday. That means Christmas Eve is on a Sunday. If we kept the same schedule for Christmas Masses this year as last year we would have eleven Masses in three days, with six on Sunday alone!! With only undesirable options to choose from, we would like to run the following proposed schedule by you:

Saturday Dec. 23: 4:00pm HF, 6:30pm SA

Sunday Dec. 24: 8:30am SM, 10:30am SA, 4:00pm HF, 4:00pm SA 8:00pm SM

Monday Dec. 25 9:00am SA.

We felt it was better to have fewer but fuller Masses than lots of Masses with few people at them. This applied especially to Christmas Day morning. Our plan would be to rotate the location of the Christmas evening and morning Masses each year like we do the Easter Vigil. Another factor is the increasing difficulty in getting priests to help. Fr. Bayuk’s health is now allowing him to only do one Mass a day. The 8:00pm Christmas Eve Mass could become like the Easter Vigil where all the choirs come together and ministers are chosen from all three parishes. Let me or a Sacred Worship Committee member know what you think of this proposal.

And sometimes getting together in Christ’s name is a bit risky. Before the regular Sacred Worship Committee meeting, the St. Mary’s members met with Bruce Kirn who is replacing the Sanctuary ceiling. He will do it this fall and will be able to give us about a two weeks notice of when he will start. When he begins, the sanctuary will be closed off behind plastic to keep the dust contained. For one weekend we will have to set up a temporary altar and podium outside the sanctuary. We shouldn’t have plaster falling on us.... but come prepared!

Next Sunday at the 8:30am and 10:30am Masses we will invite forward our Catechists, Catholic School Teachers and RCIA leaders. It takes a village to raise a child. Parents need our help and Catechists and teachers need parents help. Catechetical Sunday gives us a chance to put forming young people in Christ’s image back up near the top of our priority list where it belongs. What more important thing could we give our children than the experience that when they gather in Christ’s name, He is in the midst of them?

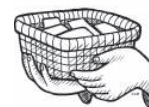

Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608-519-8002 or kbecker@cclse.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of the Vicar for Clergy or on the diocesan website at: www.dioclc.org. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. 
