Message from our Pastor ...

LOVE YOUR ENEMIES AND DO GOOD FOR THEM

What a shocking statement when Jesus told the crowd who were proud of their Mosaic Law which stated, "an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth." Moses is the law giver who brought the Israelites from the slavery of Pharaoh. Moreover the Jews believed that nobody could change the law of Moses, who had authority from God. They themselves took pride in their Divine laws.

We have to keep in mind the purpose of Matthew in writing his Gospel. He intended to show that Jesus is the new lawgiver who is giving the heart of the law. (Refer to the reflection of Fr. Tony Diaz of last Sunday).

Also keep in mind the teachings of Jesus in the previous Sundays; the Sermon on the Mount which calls the poor blessed, the peacemakers as sons of God. Now Jesus goes beyond the letter of the 10 Commandments by saying, "In ancient times you have heard that ... but I tell you..." Jesus is teaching the mind of God with a new authority. "Love your enemies and do good to all even though those who harm us". We are to react to violence and aggression with human restraint. We are to give generously to all, lending to others in need. Why? Because forgiveness and compassion and mercy are the true nature of God. We are called to be perfect as our heavenly Father is merciful. This is how we bear the image of God.

Secondly, do to others the way you wish it to be done to you. More easily said than done! We can do it only if we remember that we are going to be judged the way we treat others. Are we ready to forgive those who have hurt, ridiculed, cheated, illtreated and humiliated us? If not, we are no better than our own enemies!

A couple of things to bring to your kind attention:

Please try to come on Saturdays at 4:30 to join for the Rosary and there will be an opportunity to go to confession.

Make an effort to spend some time with the Eucharistic Jesus, an hour on First Friday of the month at 11.00 am and half an hour Adoration on other Fridays at 11.30 am.

The Sunday 8:00 a.m. Mass will be live streamed for those who are unable to come to the Church.
