Pastor's Column...

A FAMILY'S HEROIC WITNESS OF LOVE

This week, one of the parishioners mentioned to me how little is known of the wonderful work done by Christians around the world. How many charitable institutions are supported by our Catholic institutions even in Canada but very little is advertised. Then I read a story about a family's heroic witness of love in Poland.

"It was a long Lent for Catholics in Markowa, a town of 4,500 inhabitants in southeastern Poland. The year was 1944, four years into the German occupation. The villagers were looking forward to celebrating Easter, and the liberation from their occupiers that seemed near.

Like their neighbors, Józef and Wiktoria Ulma were preparing for the Holy Week liturgies. But they were also preparing for the birth of their seventh child and the possibility that the eight Jews they sheltered could come out of hiding and live again without fear.

Such anticipations came to an end, however, in the early morning hours of March 24 when German police murdered the entire Ulma family, along with the Jews they had taken in. While they did not live long enough to partake in Holy Week, the Ulmas bore witness to Christ's death and resurrection with their blood.

On Dec. 17, 2022, the Vatican approved a decree on the martyrdom of the family of Józef and Wiktoria Ulma, paving the way for their beatification Sept. 10 in a ceremony in Markowa. This is the first time an entire family will be beatified together."

MASS OFFERINGS

The tradition of giving offerings to have Masses celebrated for specific intentions is a laudable one and should be maintained as much as possible. Christ's faithful who make an offering so that Mass can be celebrated for their intention, contribute to the good of the Church, especially the support of the sacred ministers and the fulfillment of the Church's apostolic activity (cf. canon 946). Normally, a separate Mass is celebrated for each individual offering. The recommended diocesan offering for an announced (communal) Mass is \$15, to be remitted to the priest celebrant. The offering for an unannounced Mass (not announced publicly) is \$10.

The Church permits Masses with multiple intentions as an exception to normal practice. In our parish, the two Masses designated as "multiple intention" Masses will be, Sunday's at 10:00 a.m. and Friday's at 12:15 p.m. Only one Mass intention will be celebrated at all other Masses. Parishioners are encouraged to have unannounced Masses offered if the schedule fills up too quickly. These Mass intentions and offerings could be sent to the Chancery office to be celebrated by our retired priests or priests in mission territories who depend on them for their sustenance.

To request a Mass Intention, please either call the parish office (613-731-7834) or come by the office during office hours (please call to ensure the office is open).
