## Deacon's Message...

Each year the Church gives us a different aspect or feature to consider on this great feast of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. This year the well-known and beloved passage from St. Matthew's Gospel (Mt. 25.31-46) is proclaimed. The scene that Jesus describes to his disciples is the Great Judgement, the end of the world, and as we say in the Nicene Creed: "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end". Jesus identifies himself especially in the poor, the suffering, the weak, the small and the most vulnerable members of society. God has called each of us to care for those around us particularly those who are in need. St. Mother Teresa committed herself to the justice of the Kingdom of God. It's St. Mother Teresa who taught with great conviction and love that Jesus wants us to be a servant to all, especially to the poor. She summed up this Sunday's Gospel passage in five words: YOU DID IT TO ME. "At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by "I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was naked and you clothed me. I was homeless, and you took me in". St. Mother Teresa.
