# Pastor's Message...

#### A NEW TEACHING

We are used to various types of teaching: math, history, science, art etc. We are also used to different methods of teaching such as PowerPoint presentations, visual techniques, role plays and so on. During Covid, the children were taught through online classes. How about Jesus' teaching and how did people respond to him 2000 years back?

When people speak from their own convictions and experiences, people are eager to listen. Jesus spoke knowing his identity as the Son of God at Baptism. He was convinced of his own authority. Jesus said to his disciple Philip that whoever has seen me has seen my Father. Peter acknowledged his master as the Son of the living God. So Jesus spoke with authority and his authority became visible in his actions. People found a new way of teaching in his words and actions different from the Scribes and Pharisees. This is the way he talks to us today. He addresses each one of us with the force of his own life behind his words. We need to open our hearts and minds to recognize his authority over us.
