## A MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAT

Dear St. Pius X Community,

I came here 14 months ago and for the first few weeks I had the choirs sing "All are Welcome." I firmly believe that **all are welcome** if we are truly Catholic. I appreciate when you get dressed up for Mass, but appreciate more the effort a family makes just to get to Mass. We are the Body of Christ. Christ welcomed the sinner and the saint. We have a difficult reality at St. Pius X Catholic Community. We have no gathering or vestibule area and an essential part of our faith is the community sharing after Mass. Until we can afford to put a glass barrier and add the sound to the back area, we are forced to live with "a joyful noise" after Mass in the whole church, the sound of the Body of Christ growing and sharing. No one has the right to get in the way of that.

Deacons before baptisms and many others, including me in my vestments, have had people shush us and try to correct us. When this happens, I find it harder and harder to remain polite and I have instructed the Deacons and Sacristans that we protect the children and the mission of the Church. Last week we were getting people signed up for a marriage retreat and for V Encuentro or 5<sup>th</sup> Encounter, which is an amazing process for our community, for all of us; when one very selfish person made everyone feel so self-conscious that they left and some people didn't get signed up for these very important events. I can't allow any behavior that damages the growth of the Church. Self-serving behavior does not belong in church and isn't anything we learned from Jesus as he walked among us. I will take any means at my disposal to assure that all people that want to celebrate as the church calls us to, in ANY language, feel welcome. That means we all give a little.

I have asked the choirs, whenever they can, to do a prelude piece to give some quiet meditation time 5 to 6 minutes before Mass starts. Let's all work to make sure that at 10 minutes before Mass we work at transitioning from one Mass to the next for those that are scheduled close together. So, if we are still talking after one Mass and it is 10 minutes before the next, we can just move out to the ramps, or if weather is nice, outside. Please, the interaction after Mass is essential for a healthy growing community. Once prelude starts, please either pray quietly or better yet, join the singing.

### Do I stand or do I kneel or what about sitting...UGH!

At the Southwest Liturgical Conference in January, we heard that many places had transitioned to standing after receiving communion and that it quieted the church down and helped people focus on the true meaning of what we are doing, receiving our Lord in communion with each other and the universal Church. I keep hearing that after communion is "my time with Jesus" and that really isn't what the Church asks of us at that time. We are receiving and should be praying in communion. That said, I have made a mess. I asked that we try standing until the prayer after communion and then either sit or kneel for your own personal prayer after the prayer after communion. Some Masses 40% stand, 40% kneel, and the rest are sitting or doing a combo of both.

I had decided to just say that it didn't work and to go back to kneeling until I told a few people and they all said that they had come to like standing. I now find myself with a conundrum. I never would have started this had I realized how big of a deal it would be for some parishioners. As a friend says, the juice has not been worth the squeeze. My intent was never to cause such friction over our stance at communion, even if it is what the rubrics for Mass call for.

I discussed this with the Liturgy committee and this is what I want to try in order to come to some resolution. I want each of you to decide what works best for you while keeping the following things in mind:

1. The church is much quieter and reverent with those that have decided to stand.
2. This isn't our solitary time with our God; this is community time and we should be praying for each other. If someone distracts you, that is probably just a call to pray for them.
3. We sing better standing and singing unites us.
4. Kneelers are noisy; please beware of that if you use one, especially after communion.

Finally, take the position of standing, sitting or kneeling that best enables you to pray for each other and helps bring our community closer to God and helps us to leave Mass ready to proclaim the Gospel by our lives.

We will add a slide to announcements to help visitors and are going to add music to assist in this reflection at most of the Masses.
