A MESSAGE FROM FATHER PAT

Dear St. Pius X Community,

I find it hard to believe that we are in the month of November. WOW! It almost feels like whiplash. What a great time to pause and reflect on how we bring in this month with All Saints and All Souls celebrations. I had a few people upset with the "Day of the Dead" altar in the back of the church where we honor our dead. From my first trip here in 1985, one of the things I love about this area is the blending of cultures. Each culture adds its best to create a truly rich and diverse community here. Just walk through NIOSA sometime and look at all the different cultures represented here. Or in a normal year the festivals like Wurstfest and Cinco de Mayo. From Bratwurst to Enchiladas to Pho, we are blessed. The first time I saw a Dia de los Muertos altar, I was a little taken back. I thought I would explain the symbols to give you a better understanding of what the altar represents.

The Skulls - They represent the loved ones that have died and are made of sugar to represent the sweetness of life. (Ours may have been taken.)

The Perforated Paper - It is to remind us that nothing can hold us here. In ancient times it was thought to allow the soul to come and go.

Pan de Muerto (bread of the dead) - This soft and sweet bread is designed with a circle and limbs to mimic the shape of a skull and crossbones and is finished with a dusting of sugar. It's just one of a number of food stuff that can be placed at altars for hungry souls to partake in. I have a friend that puts tequila on the altar. It disappears over the month. He mistakenly thinks he is fooling his wife!

Marigolds (flowers of the dead) - The scent of these bright orange blooms is said to draw in the souls to the altar.

Salt - As in the Seder meal is said to help quench the thirst of souls. It helps to purify them.

Photographs - Obviously we have the pictures of our loved ones that we are praying are with God and our own personal saints.

Does this have non-Catholic roots? ABSOLUTELY! So do incense, candles, water (do I need to continue?....) The bright colors, for me, remind me of the joy we have been promised and the multifaceted love of our God for us. What a perfect time to have this altar as we, the St. Pius X community, grieve and mourn with the Derrington family, as Monique is now with God! What an amazing example of faith!

With luck, when you are reading this, our new livestream system will be in place. A special thanks to the family that made this possible. This will do a few things for us. First, we will free up more seats in the church for Masses. Second, it will give us studio quality sound and video. Finally, we will have a hard wire to the Family Center for HD video and sound in there, so we will have a dedicated video feed to help us with overflow for the pandemic and later for holidays.

We also have our own projection system for movie night. I am very impressed again with the Projector People and the amazing products they helped us select. The sound and picture were amazing at our last movie night! We are thinking about doing something a little different for the next few movie nights. We can start with a cartoon or cartoons followed by a classic John Wayne or other like movies. Kids get their show and can play or sleep, then a classic? Thoughts?

I am excited about the **Book of Isaiah** classes coming up starting in early December for our next Theology on Tap series. We are currently talking about Advent so feel free to join us on Tuesday evenings via Zoom at 6:30 PM.

DEACON & DEACON CANDIDATE CORNER

Our Second Reading this weekend comes from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians. He wrote this letter around the year 51 A. D. because of the reports he was receiving concerning the trials that the Christian community that he had recently founded was enduring from both the Jews and the Gentiles. In Chapter 4 of this letter he has some very specific exhortations that he makes to the community concerning pleasing God through living a moral life, being charitable, and the hope for the Christian dead that our reading this weekend specifically addresses. By this time in the First Century people who had been converted and Baptized were beginning to die. At that time the general belief was that Christ would be returning soon, a belief that St. Paul shared. Christians began to question, "What happens if I die before the Lord returns?" St. Paul assumes that the Parousia, the Second Coming of Christ, would occur in his lifetime, but he wanted people to understand that while the time of the coming was unknown, more important than when it would occur, the most important aspect of the Parousia was the fulfillment of our personal union with Christ. His pastoral exhortation focuses first on hope for the departed faithful, then on the need of preparedness for those who have yet to achieve their goal, their personal union with Christ.

I believe that it's that pastoral exhortation that holds the most importance for us today. Obviously, the Parousia did not occur then, and it hasn't occurred yet, and as the Gospel of Matthew tells us in Chapter 24, no one except the Father knows the time when it will occur. So, as St. Paul tells us, we must be ready now. We need to live our lives everyday as if it is our last and not be too concerned about when the Parousia will happen. Chances are good, that just like that first generation of Christians that St. Paul was exhorting and were dying out before Christ's return, we too may well be gone before He returns. We have a chance to reconcile our relationship with God right now, but it is best not to wait. Because as the Gospel tells us, only the Father knows the date and time of the coming, nor do we know the date and time we will leave this world. We need to be prepared now!

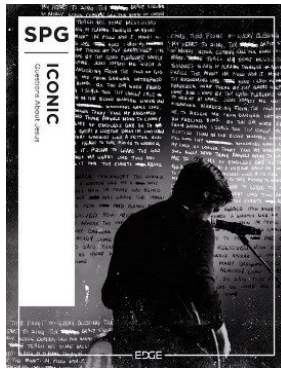

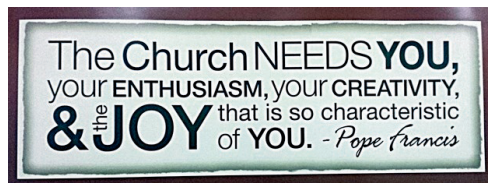

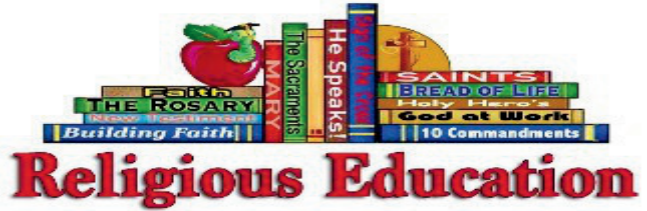
