

DEACON TONY'S REFLECTIONS

The last weekend of Advent we discussed, "All I need for Christmas is: Peace." While preparing my homily, I read several articles about what it takes to achieve "Peace of Mind". One article was a study from Duke University that focused on eight factors which contributed greatly to a person's emotional and mental stability and happiness that I would like to share.

- Factor 1: The absence of suspicion and resentment.

 Nursing a grudge was a major factor in unhappiness.
- Factor 2: **Not living in the past.**An unwholesome preoccupation with old mistakes and failures leads to depression.
- Factor 3: Not wasting time and energy fighting conditions you cannot change. Cooperate with life, instead of trying to run away from it.
- Factor 4: Force yourself to stay involved with the living world.

 Resist the temptation to withdraw and become reclusive during periods of emotional stress.
- Factor 5: Refuse to indulge in self-pity when life hands you a raw deal. Accept the fact that nobody gets through life without some sorrow and misfortune.
- Factor 6: Cultivate the old-fashioned virtues--love, humor, compassion and loyalty.
- Factor 7: **Do not expect too much of yourself.**When there is too wide a gap between self-expectation and your ability to meet the goals you have set, feelings of inadequacy are inevitable.
- Factor 8: Find something bigger than yourself to believe in.

 Self-centered egotistical people score lowest in any test for measuring happiness.

I hope you can reflect on these factors in your own lives. Achieving Peace of Mind is the foundation for attaining a knowledge of the Peace of God. Blessings,

THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

This Sunday's celebration of the Baptism of the Lord closes the Christmas season. In the scriptures we see one more epiphany, or manifestation, of the Spirit of God in Jesus—but this time it is as an adult, rather than as a child. Jesus' baptism also serves as the inauguration of his prophetic mission and the messianic age.

Today's reading from Isaiah describes God's chosen Messiah, upon whom God's spirit rests. In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says that "God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power" (Acts 10:38). Finally, in the proclamation from Matthew's Gospel Jesus' baptism in water goes almost unnoticed. The crucial moment comes when the Spirit of God comes upon Jesus and a voice from heaven echoes the words of Isaiah: "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17). SUBMITTED FOR REVIEW RECOMMENDED NEW PARISH NAMES

The following recommended names for our new merged parish were compiled from the over 300 suggestions submitted by the parishioners of our three churches. The Pastoral Council members of our three churches reviewed each suggested name and rationale and narrowed the names down to the recommended names. These names have been submitted to Bishop Zubik, who will then select three names from this list. He will then inform us of the three names chosen for our review. We will all have the opportunity to rank the three names and submit those rankings to the bishop. The new name of our new merged parish will then be chosen by Bishop Zubik.

Recommended New Parish Name

Rationale

Divine Savior Above all, we look to God who is the ultimate reason for our lives and faith of the resurrection

and everlasting life.

Our Lady of Hope With everything that has happened in the last few years. With the uncertainty with the Catholic

Church. With the blending of 3 parishes that sometimes seems impossible. I feel Our Lady of

Hope is a fitting name.

St. Ignatius of Loyola Pray to St. Ignatius for generosity, serenity, and offering

St. Josaphat He promoted unity between East and West Churches in the 1600's. He is invoked as the "Apostle"

of Unity" - which is fitting for our grouping

St. Maria Faustina St. Faustina was visited by Jesus who presented himself as the "King of Divine Mercy" She was

asked to become the apostle and secretary of God's mercy. Jesus said to her "My Daughter, do whatever is within your power to spread devotion to My Divine Mercy, I will make up for what you lack." This name would help to promote the need for all to seek Jesus' Divine Mercy.

Sts. Louis and Zélie

The first married couple to be canonized, known for holiness, marriage and endurance. The

The first married couple to be canonized, known for holiness, marriage and endurance. They were from different parishes and met while crossing the St. Leonard bridge. Zélie and Louis wanted to found a family of saints, and Zélie always knew she would give the world "a great saint." We are in the process of "marrying" three parishes into one, bridging together holy people, hoping to found a new parish of saints. With God's Grace, may we endure in holiness!

Madonna of the Streets Although artist Roberto Ferruzzi denied his intent was to draw Mary with Child, Catholics

around the world know the picture that comes to mind when the name is stated. In keeping with our mission to be a presence in our community, with Mary as our mother, we will hit the streets.

St. Peter Claver He is considered a heroic example of what should be the Christian praxis of love and the exercise

of human rights. He was instrumental in protesting the cruelty of the African slave trade. St. Peter saw the slaves as fellow Christians, encouraging others to do so as well. During his 40 years of ministry he personally catechized and baptized over 300,000 slaves. He would then follow up on them to ensure that as Christians they received their Christian and civil rights.

He is a great example today of the Church's response to the needs of the oppressed.

SS. Martha and Mary

The friends of Jesus, who served the Lord as disciples and his surrogate family. They remind

us of our call as the Church to be the friend and family of others.

St. Helena Had a son Constantine born in 274 AD. Through her son's influence Helena embraced

Christianity. She was a devout servant of God. (a lot more)

St. Dominic A story was shared during Mass recently of how St. Dominic's mother had a dream about diving

birth to a dog carrying a flaming torch that "seemed to set the earth on fire." In the spirit of "on Mission for the Church Alive, I believe we are being asked to carry the flaming torch of the

gospel to those around us like St. Dominic did in his lifetime

St. Lucy I had a serious eye issue and had five surgeries. With the help of St. Lucy, my vision was saved.

St. Oscar Romero Oscar Romero is an El Salvadorian martyr who, In May 1979, visited the Pope in Rome and

presented him with seven dossiers filled with reports and documents describing the injustices against the people in El Salvador. Romero committed himself to the poor and the persecuted, and he became the catalyst for radical moral prophecy in the church and outside it. He believed in peace and led the country torn by war and wrought with injustice in a devotion to Our Lady, Queen of Peace. We need a patron who will pray for us to work for justice and peace, in this

time of confusion and terrorism, hate and racism in our country

St. Angela of the Cross Born in Seville, Spain, she was a hard worker who encouraged her employees to pray together.

She founded a Spanish Roman Catholic religious order which helped to take care of the area poor, sick and hungry, just like the parishioners in our grouping do now through the food banks

and St. Vincent de Paul.

PRAYER FOR IMMIGRANTS & REFUGEES



What is Eucharistic Adoration?

The spiritual practice of spending time before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament — Eucharistic adoration fell by the wayside in many parishes over the years. An understanding of it faded from the teachings in our Catholic schools and religious education programs, leaving generations unaware of this great opportunity for the faithful to build a personal relationship with our Lord and to realize the power of the Eucharist In our loves.

As we renovate the chapel in the St. Patrick Center, once used by the Sisters who staffed St. Patrick School, we are preparing to renew opportunities for this spiritual aide to be available for all our parishioners. To help with our understanding of spending time in the presence of our Lord, we provide a teaching of what Eucharistic adoration is, why we have it, and how each of us can enter into Eucharistic adoration with a sense of confidence and surety that Our Lord is present to and for us.

This is PART 1 of a four-part series to be included in our weekly bulletin, leading to our first day of Eucharistic adoration scheduled in the renovated Adoration Chapel on Friday, February 7. At the same time, we are in the process of scheduling the Adoration Chapel to be open for quiet prayer on Sunday momings between Masses and when requested by parishioners during the week. This latter opportunity with require more time to accomplish before it is implemented. Nevertheless, it is our hope and prayer that we grow in a greater love for the Lord as we see a greater need to have His presence in our lives.



Eucharistic adoration is the respect and worship we give to Jesus, who is truly present to us under the appearance of bread and wine. The Eucharist is a priceless treasure. By not only celebrating it but also by praying before it outside of Mass, we are enabled to make contact with the very wellspring of grace, As St. Alphonsus Liguori noted, "of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the sacraments, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us." [CCC1418]

WHAT FORM DOES THIS ADORATION TAKE?

We show our adoration in many ways. The most intimate form of adoration is Holy Communion, when we receive Jesus' body into our own. The most common and ordinary way we adore Jesus us by genuflecting — that is, kneeling briefly on one knee — whenever we pass the tabernacle in a church (see Philippians 2:10). Outside the Mass, the Church gives us further opportunities to worship Jesus. We may visit Him at the tabernacle. And we may adore Him when the Sacrament is brought out from the tabernacle for public worship. This is commonly called "exposition." [CCC1378]

WHAT IS EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT?

Exposition is the placement of the Sacred (consecrated) Host outside THE BLESSED SACRAMENT? the tabernacle for public adoration. This can take many forms. The Benediction is a rite in which a priest or

All are encouraged to continue reading Parts 2, 3 and 4 of our understanding of Eucharistic adoration, which will be included in parish bulletins the next three weeks. Begin to speak to your friends about Eucharistic adoration. simplest form is the opening of the tabernacle doors. Another form is

the removal of the sacred vessels from the tabernacle for a more prominent and visible placement, The Church also permits a "full" exposition, when the Sacred Host is clearly visible in a vessel called a "monstrance."

WHAT IS THE PURPPOSE OF EXPOSITION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT?

There are three purposes of Eucharistic exposition: (1) to acknowledge Christ's marvelous presence in the Sacrament; (2) to lead us to a fuller participation in the celebration of the Eucharist, culminating in Holy Communion; and (3) to foster the worship which is due to Christ in Spirit and in truth.

WHAT CONDITIONS ARE NECESSARY FOR PROPER EXPOSITION OF THE SACRAMENT?

The sponsors of this devotion should make sure that a suitable number of worshippers are present during the entire time of exposition. The Church also asks us to light candles around the Sacrament, and permits us to use incense. The Blessed Sacrament may never be left exposed without at least one worshipper present.

WHAT IS BENEDICTION WITH THE BLESSED SACRAMENT?

Benediction is a rite in which a priest or deacon pronounces a blessing over those who are present for Eucharistic adoration. As he gives
the blessing, he elevates the monstrance or other vessel that contains the Sacred Host. Benediction normally follows a period of
prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, just prior to its reposition into
the tabernacle.

En el último fin de semana de Adviento discutimos, "Todo lo que necesito para la Navidad es: Paz." Mientras preparaba mi homilía, leí varios artículos sobre lo que se necesita para lograr la "Paz Mental". Uno de los artículos era un estudio de la Universidad de Duke que se centraba en ocho factores que contribuyen en gran medida a la estabilidad emocional y mental de una persona y a la felicidad que me gustaría compartir.

- Factor 1: La ausencia de la sospecha y el resentimiento. El guardar rencor fue un factor mayor en la infelicidad.
- Factor 2: **No vivir en el pasado**. Una preocupación malsana con los errores y fracasos del pasado nos lleva a la depresión.
- Factor 3: No perder el tiempo y la energía luchando contra condiciones que no se pueden cambiar. Coopere con la vida, en lugar de tratar de huir de ella.
- Factor 4: Forzarte a seguir involucrado con el mundo viviente. Resistir la tentación de retirarse y volverse solitario durante los períodos de estrés emocional.
- Factor 5: Rechace la tentación de tener lástima de sí mismo cuando la vida le ofrezca un trato injusto. Acepte el hecho de que nadie pasa por la vida sin alguna pena o desgracia.
- Factor 6: **Cultive las virtudes más antiguas**: el amor, el buen humor, la compasión y la lealtad.
- Factor 7: **No exija demasiado de ti mismo**. Cuando hay una brecha demasiado grande entre la expectativa de sí mismo y su capacidad para alcanzar las metas que se ha fijado, los sentimientos de insuficiencia son inevitables.
- Factor 8: Encuentre algo más grande que su propio ser para creer en ello. Las personas egoístas y centradas en sí mismas obtienen la puntuación más baja en cualquier prueba para medir la felicidad.

Espero que puedan reflexionar sobre estos factores en sus propias vidas. Alcanzar la Paz Mental es la base para lograr el conocimiento de la Paz de Dios.


