The chaplain of the Washington County Jail has asked our parish if we could provide new or gently used paperback Catholic Bibles for their Catholic inmates.

The bible versions could be NAB, RSV, NABRE, or Jerusalem. 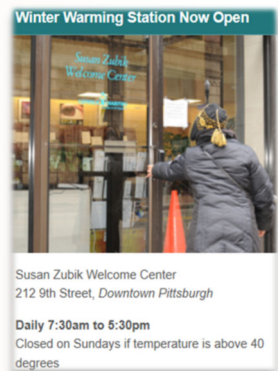
OFFICES CLOSED

Part 2

What is Eucharistic Adoration?

This is PART 2 of our four-part series in the understanding of Eucharistic adoration and its importance in our lives and the life of the Church. Parishioners desiring clarification of any aspect of our providing Eucharistic Adoration should contact any of the priests. Please make sure you read all four parts of this series. Earlier copies are available at the offices at St. Patrick Church during normal hours.

WHAT ARE THE FRUITS OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

People who observe Eucharistic adoration experience a deeper devotion to Jesus, and this manifests itself in countless ways. The primary fruits are repentance and conversion which lead to increased charity — that is, the love of Christ alive in his people. The adoration of Jesus in the Eucharist also leads to greater reverence at Mass, a deeper desire for personal holiness, and a stronger sense of union with the parish and the whole Church. Ever since the early centuries of Christianity, the Church has linked Eucharistic devotion to service to the poor. More recently, the practice has led to an increase in vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life.

HOW LONG HAVE CHRISTIANS PRACTICED EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

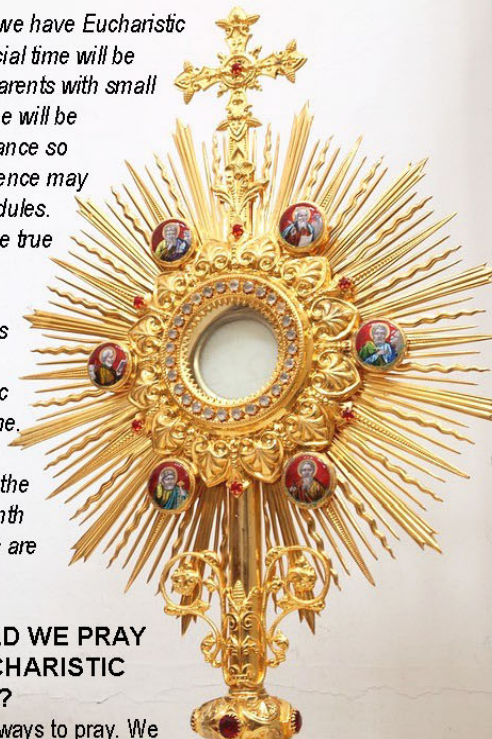
Christians have adored the Eucharist as long as the Church has celebrated the Eucharist — that is, from the time of the Apostles. The earliest texts that speak of the Mass are probably older than some of the New Testament books. In every generation since the generation of the Apostles, the Church Fathers wrote about Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist. In the second, third and fourth centuries, Christians in lands as far-flung as Italy, Egypt, North Africa, and Cappadocia (modern-day Turkey) testify to the special care given to the Eucharist that was reserved for the sick and homebound.

WHAT IS PROPER ETIQUETTE DURING EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

When we are not taking part in vocal prayers and hymns with other adorers, we should be praying silently. Whenever we pass before the place where the Sacred Host is reserved, we should genuflect. We should observe the modest dress and decorum that are appropriate to very solemn occasions. We should avoid any actions that might disturb or distract others or draw attention to ourselves rather than Jesus.

Eucharistic Adoration begins FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 7, in our renovated Adoration Chapel in the St. Patrick Center. It will begin with Mass at 8:00AM and conclude with benediction at 8:50PM that evening. NOTE: When we have Eucharistic adoration, a special time will be established for parents with small children. This time will be published in advance so those wishing silence may adjust their schedules. The same may be true for groups or organizations, such as our teens who may wish to incorporate music in their prayer time. Parishioners are asked to refer to the bulletin each month once these times are established..



HOW SHOULD WE PRAY DURING EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

There are many ways to pray. We may meditate silently by gazing on the Sacred Host. We may silently speak to Jesus from our heart and mind. We may also rely on devotions and prayers from Catholic tradition, such as the reading of Scripture, recitation of the rosary, or the litanies. When two or more are gathered before the Blessed Sacrament, they may pray or sing hymns together if planned in advance.

NOTE: More will be said of how to pray before the Blessed Sacrament in two weeks — PART 4. There is no right or wrong way. Our intention at these times, however, is always, first and foremost, in giving adoration to our Lord and Savior.

WHAT IS THE EUCHARIST?

The Eucharist is the Sacrament that Jesus established when he took bread and wine, blessed them, and declared them to be His Body and Blood (see Luke 22:17-20). He commanded his disciples to "Do this in memory of me." He had earlier foretold that His presence in the Eucharist would be real and substantial: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever... Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." (John 6:51, 54-55). When a Catholic priest follows this command of Jesus and offers the words of consecration, the bread and wine are permanently changed, and they become Jesus: His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. [CCC1373-1376, 1406, 1410, 1412-1413]

LA VIRTUD DE LA GRATITUD

(SEGUNDA PARTE)

Sirva esta anécdota como ejemplo a lo que digo. Había un ciego sentado en la vereda con una gorra a sus pies y una tabla de madera donde se leía: “Por favor, ayúdeme. Soy ciego.” Una persona que pasaba se detuvo delante de él y vio las pocas monedas que había en la gorra. Le pidió permiso para escribir algo distinto. Tomó la tabla de madera, borró el anuncio y escribió otro con una tiza, volviendo a ponerlo sobre los pies del ciego y se fue. Al día siguiente, al pasar por el mismo lugar frente al ciego, vio que la gorra estaba llena de monedas y billetes. El ciego, que reconoció sus pasos le preguntó que había escrito en el cartel: “Nada que no sea tan cierto como tu anuncio, sólo que con otras palabras”. El ciego nunca lo supo pero su cartel ahora decía: “¡Hoy es primavera y no la puedo ver!”...

En segundo lugar, debemos sentir gratitud hacia nuestros padres que nos trajeron al mundo, que nos cuidaron, que nos alimentaron y que seguramente nos han brindado afecto, seguridad, protección y educación. En el caso de que nada de esto nos hayan dado, igualmente les debemos la vida. Este sentimiento tan noble de la gratitud hacia su padre quedó maravillosamente expresado en la carta que el teniente Roberto Néstor Estévez, muerto en 1982 en la guerra de Malvinas, dejó plasmado en una carta de despedida escrita a su padre:

“Querido Pipo: Cuando recibas esta carta, yo ya estaré rindiendo cuentas de mis acciones a Dios nuestro Señor. Él que sabe lo que hace, así lo ha dispuesto: que muera en el cumplimiento de mi misión; pero fijáte vos ¡qué misión! ¿No es cierto? ¿Te acordás cuando era chico y hacía planes, diseñaba vehículos y armas para recuperar las islas Malvinas y restaurar en ellas nuestra soberanía?. Dios, que es un Padre generoso, ha querido que este su hijo, totalmente carente de méritos, viva esta experiencia única y deje su vida en ofrenda a nuestra Patria. Lo único que a todos quiero pedirles es: 1) Que restauren una sincera unidad en la familia bajo la Cruz de Cristo. 2) Que me recuerden con alegría y no que mi evocación sea la apertura a la tristeza. Y muy importante. 3) Que recen por mí. Pipo, hay cosas que, en un día cualquiera, no se dicen entre hombres, pero hoy debo decírtelas: **Gracias** por tenerte como modelo de bien nacido, **gracias** por creer en el honor, **gracias** por tener tu apellido, **gracias** por ser católico, argentino e hijo de sangre española, **gracias** por ser soldado, **gracias** a Dios por ser como soy y que es fruto de ese hogar donde vos sos el pilar. Hasta el reencontro, si Dios lo permite. Un fuerte abrazo. Dios y Patria ¡o Muerte! Roberto”(1).
