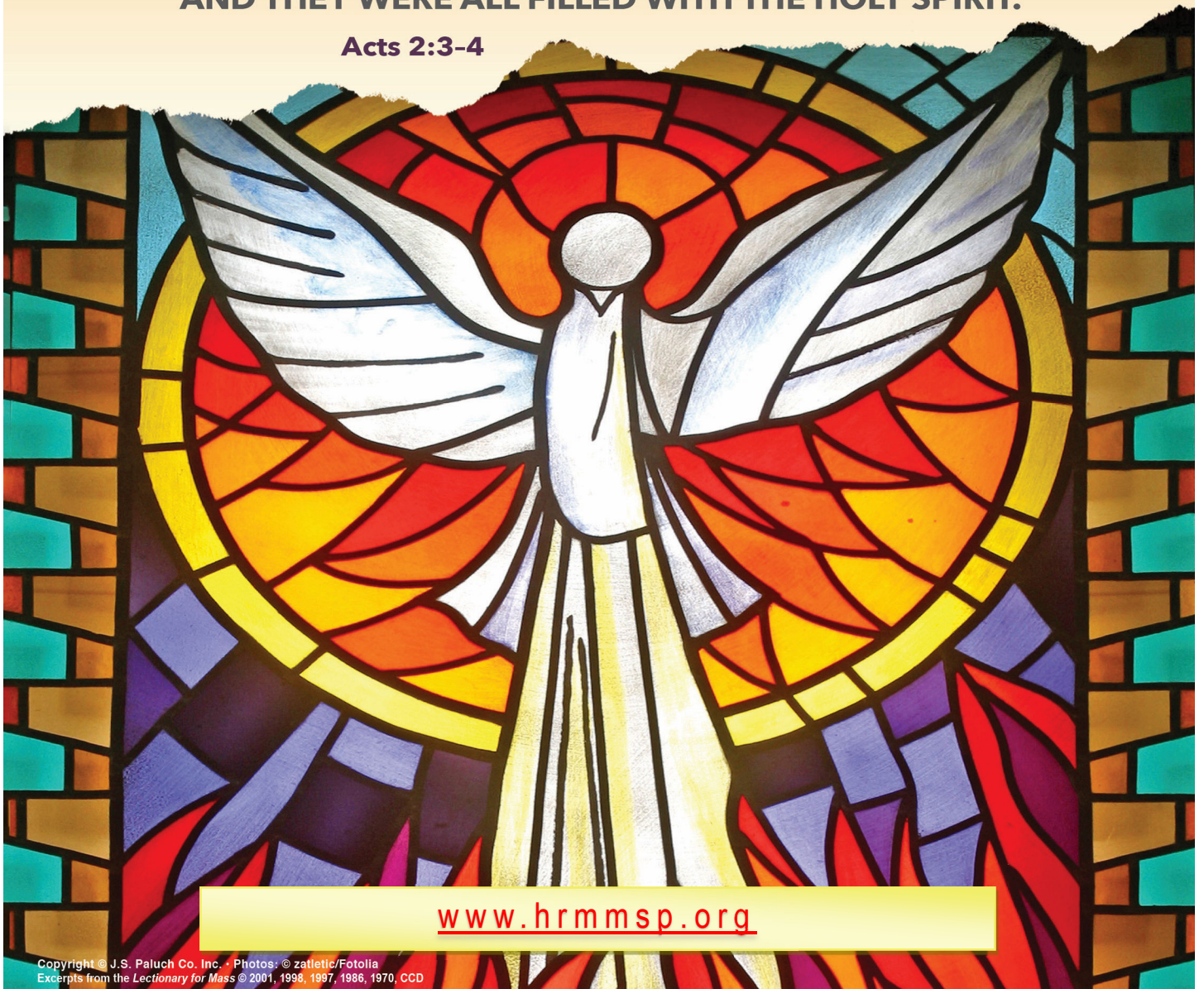

DAILY MASS TO RESUME WITH RESTRICTIONS

Physical attendance at daily Mass will resume Monday, June 1 at Miraculous Medal site at 10 a.m.

At this time, and in conjunction with the CDC and Diocesan guidelines, daily Mass will be limited to 24 persons plus the priest. Please call Patty at 724-745-6560 to reserve a space for a weekday Mass. We ask that you schedule only one weekday Mass at this time to allow other parishioners the opportunity to attend Mass. You must wear a mask and follow all church directives. Please stay home if you do not feel well as Mass will continue to be live streamed. Until further notice, weekend Masses will be live-streamed only. If you are in any of risk categories per the CDC, please do not come to Mass: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/need-extra-precautions/people-at-higher-risk.html>.

Other Recent Updates

Churches are permitted to open for **private prayer** with safety guidelines in place including seating in designated areas only, the use of masks, hand sanitizers, and social distancing. Private prayer is held from 1 to 2 p.m. Monday through Friday at Miraculous Medal only.

Confessions – Confessionals do not meet public health safety requirements. Penitents must practice social distancing and all other safety guidelines. No appointments are needed for reconciliation at the St. Patrick Parish Center: Tuesdays from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 Noon.

Fr. Tom Galvin will be at the side entrance (through the gate) to the Center. A chair will be available for the penitent who will be outside (under cover) and will be able to speak through the door, left slightly open. A screen will provide anonymity for the penitent. The line

will form across the street (Hutchinson) and markings will be made on the pavement for the sake of social distancing.

Appointments are needed for confessions at:

Miraculous Medal Site — Saturdays from 1 to 3 PM. Please call 724-222-1911 by Friday. You do not need to give your name. These are held with Fr. Carmen in the rectory entrance at the mail slot.

St. Patrick Site — Appointments may be scheduled with Fr. Tom Gillespie by calling the parish office at 724-745-6560.

Holy Rosary Site — Appointments may be scheduled with Fr. George DeVille by calling the parish office at 724-745-3531.

Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals can be scheduled but with the restrictions of no more than 25 people present. Great care must be given to social distancing, wearing masks, and sanitization precautions.

MARÍA EN EL MISTERIO DE PENTECOSTÉS

El Espíritu Santo, es decir, aquél que es invisible a nuestros ojos pero visible a partir de sus efectos en la naturaleza, las personas y las circunstancias, favoreciendo la experiencia de Dios en la vida de los hombres y de las mujeres de cada época, marcó de manera especial el camino e historia personal de María. Ella aceptó ser parte de la causa del Espíritu Santo, convirtiéndose en la madre de Jesús y, desde ahí, acompañando a los primeros discípulos tras la ascensión de su hijo al cielo. Si bien es cierto que Cristo involucró a Pedro y, posteriormente, a Pablo en la continuación de su proyecto, no es menos cierto que en los momentos más críticos, es decir, cuando la fe corría el riesgo de extinguirse ante la persecución de las autoridades judías, fue María quien se mantuvo firme y se quedó con los discípulos hasta las últimas consecuencias, asumiendo un liderazgo silencioso pero verdaderamente significativo.

Fue una mujer la que inspiró valor a los primeros seguidores de Jesús, mientras esperaban el cumplimiento del misterio de Pentecostés: “todos ellos perseveraban en la oración y con un mismo espíritu, en compañía de algunas mujeres, de María, la madre de Jesús, y de sus hermanos” (Hch. 1, 14). Como dijo el Papa Benedicto XVI durante el rezo del Regina Caeli correspondiente al 23 de marzo del año 2010, “no hay Pentecostés sin la Virgen María”. Dicho en palabras del Venerable P. Félix de Jesús Rougier, “con ella todo, sin ella nada”. ¿Quién mejor que María para sostener la fe del primer Papa de la historia y de los discípulos que habían entrado en contacto con Jesús pero que tenían miedo de correr su misma suerte? Ella que había contemplado el rostro vivo de Cristo estaba dispuesta a permanecer firme en lo dicho, es decir, en aquella respuesta positiva que había pronunciado durante la anunciación. Si hay algo que debemos valorar e imitar del ejemplo de la Virgen María es su fidelidad a prueba de todo.

Una mujer valiente y abierta al proyecto de Dios. El Espíritu Santo no es una simple devoción de una región o

país del mundo. Se trata de una de las tres personas de la Santísima Trinidad. María lo entendió y vivió de esta manera. En ella, encontramos las claves para mejorar nuestra relación con el Espíritu Santo. En primer lugar, confiando cada vez más en su ayuda pues aunque vivimos en tiempos marcados por las crisis, hemos de dar el paso de creer que detrás de todo lo malo o negativo que pudiera entristecernos, nos encontramos con un Dios que nos anima a descubrir nuevas oportunidades en las dificultades. María vivió la crisis que llevó a su hijo a la cruz y, a pesar de esto, fue capaz de creer y de rediseñar la historia, promoviendo una cultura de la vida. El Espíritu Santo no es algo abstracto sino alguien que nos llama a la confianza, a recuperar la fe que quizá hemos perdido con el paso de los años. En segundo lugar, no hay que perder de vista la necesidad de ser constructores de su reinado en medio del mundo, es decir, en los diferentes contextos de la vida. Si hemos encontrado en el Espíritu Santo la fuerza y el sentido que andábamos buscando ¿por qué no ilusionarnos y compartir esa alegría y felicidad con el mundo de hoy? Como María, podemos ser constructores de un nuevo Pentecostés en nuestra familia, trabajo e Iglesia. Antes de cambiar a los demás, empecemos por nosotros mismos.

En María se puede apreciar la realización del misterio de Pentecostés. Lo vemos en su valor para sostener a los discípulos, acogiendo los con cariño e ilusión. Como ella, busquemos un espacio para entrar en contacto con Dios haciendo un repaso de nuestra historia personal. Dejemos que el Espíritu Santo sea quien nos acompañe en medio del recorrido que nos espera. Él es quien nos perdona y entrega una nueva oportunidad para generar un cambio positivo.

On May 1, Fr. Carmen submitted the five top names chosen by our parishioners to Bishop Zubik. Those names parishioners voted on in January were Divine Savior, St. Lucy, St. Dominic, St. Angela of the Cross and St. Oscar Romero.

Sometime this weekend, Bishop Zubik will formally announce the merger of our three parishes into one new parish as well as the new name. Our new parish will begin operations on July 1, 2020. The clergy and staff are working on the necessary changes to make this as seamless as possible.

THE RICHNESS OF THE SPIRIT

Students, and most adults recalling their school days, are familiar with the phrase “compare and contrast” that shows up from time to time on tests. Today we hear two different accounts of the giving of the Holy Spirit to the church. Let’s contrast, then compare. Luke’s account from Acts is filled with arresting details: the mighty wind from heaven, the tongues of flame, the miracle of different languages. John’s account seems timid: fearful disciples, the wounded Christ, the expelling of breath from his risen body, not from the sky. Our literal, modern minds wonder which way it happened; our noisy culture probably makes us prefer the former. But if we compare the two, we find that the dazzling richness of the Spirit fills both accounts, for it is the very breath of the risen Christ, ascended to the sky in Luke, that appears to his disciples in John and sends his followers forth to carry on his mission of forgiving sin and proclaiming the mighty acts of God.
