St. Francis de Sales Cathedral in Baker City, is the cathedral parish of the Diocese of Baker, the eastern two-thirds of the State of Oregon. Consecrated and almost dedicated 116 years ago; 37 years after the first Catholic priests arrived in Baker Valley, the Cathedral continues to operate as our diocesan community's spiritual home. She stands as a gift that has been passed down from one generation to the next.

Maintaining the historic Cathedral will preserve our diocesan community's spiritual home for another century and beyond. Your donation to the *Cathedral Conservation Campaign*, started in 2020, continues to support repairs, restoration, and preservation of the Cathedral. *The Fund will be held in trust by the Diocese of Baker for the conservation of the Cathedral building only.*

Since its inception, this collection has assisted the Cathedral in two major projects. Last year, through your generosity, the fund received an additional \$106,468 bringing the current balance to \$232,000. There was no work assigned for 2022 in anticipation of the next major project which will be the replacement of the front steps and sidewalks.


If you look at the photos at right and below you can see that this is going to be a structural challenge. Fr. Suresh Telagani has already consulted an architect. It was quickly determined that structural engineers need to be involved in the process as the front of the cathedral is supported by the steps needing to be replaced. Although actual construction estimates have not yet been finalized, initial projections for the cost could be in excess of \$1,000,000. Your help is greatly needed.

Let us continue our commitment to our beloved cathedral and to keep it in the best condition we can for future generations of Catholics.
