WYD LISBON 2023

Twenty youth, young adults, and adults from Klamath Falls (7), Hood River (2), Boardman (4), La Grande (3), Baker City (1),

Enterprise (1), Eugene (1), and the Pastoral Center (1), began their pilgrimage to World Youth Day (WYD) with a journey to Boise, Idaho. They joined up with 35 pilgrims of the Diocese of Boise for a shared pilgrimage to Portugal. This larger group, affectionately nicknamed "Boise-Baker" by the pilgrimage guide, was a continuation of an interdiocesan relationship forged through the annual Idaho Catholic Youth Conference (ICYC). It was beautiful to witness how well the two groups blended together, forming new friendships and connections through the shared experiences.

Spiritual experiences were the core of this pilgrimage, as it is for most pilgrimages to a World Youth Day. We enjoyed daily Mass with many, celebrated by two priests from the Diocese of Boise, Fr. Camiio García (Rupert), and Fr. Nelson Cintra, newly ordained. Both became our spiritual guides who blessed and enhanced our experience.

Many pilgrims shared about their experiences of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at various churches in Lisbon.

One noted the profound difference from the noise of so many people outside to the reverent peace and silence, only steps always, inside a church. Others shared experiences of finding unexpected relics of saints, having unexpected conversations with religious sisters or priests, and of accidentally being in the right place at the right time.

One pilgrim put it this way, "I was in a place I wasn't supposed to be, I met someone I wasn't supposed to meet, and I had a conversation I wasn't supposed to have, and I heard exactly what I needed to hear." Another said, "We would start off with a plan, then get distracted or lost, and wind up someplace better. God was helping us to see that no matter what we plan, He always knows what we need. When we trust Him, it is better than anything we can plan for ourselves." And another, "I have been learning to let go, and let God lead."

All pilgrimages are a combination of the "amazing" or "fantastic" and the "trial and tribulation". A profound sense among all pilgrims was the presence of God in the hardest trials as well as the greatest joys. We had been counseled and encouraged to have an intention for the pilgrimage, whether for ourselves, our family, someone in particular,

our vocation, or a question we were seeking an answer. And every one of us experienced the strength of carrying and praying for an intention in those moments of trial, or exhaustion, or aches and pains, or stress in a large crowd ... It didn't matter the trial - carrying an intention is what carried each one through adversity.

The highlight of any World Youth Day is the experience of the larger Church. Pilgrims gathered with hundreds of thousands of other Catholic pilgrims for the Opening Mass, a national gathering of US pilgrims, Welcoming Pope Francis, Stations of the Cross, and the overnight vigil and closing Mass with Pope Francis. The ending gathering was an overnight camp-out in a large area. There were musicians, speakers, prayer, Adoration, and the Pope. Being in the presence of the successor of Peter is an experience that is hard to put to words, and when that experience is shared with half a million to a million and a half other Catholics, there is only wonder and awe! One pilgrim whose faith was strengthened in the midst of this experience shared, "And for every one pilgrim here, there are more than 1,000 other Catholics in the world!"

At the national gathering of US pilgrims, Bishop Burn of Dallas, Texas, said 38% of priests and women and men in religious life attended a World Youth Day. Fr. Nelson Cintra, who was ordained this past June, is one of those priests. Twelve years ago he attended World Youth Day in Madrid and it changed his faith and his life. While only God knows the seeds of Vocations He planted in hearts at this World Youth Day, every one of the pilgrims from the Diocese of Baker has brought back an experience of faith they are eager to share with their parishes, with fellow students at college, with co-workers, and with anyone God brings their way!

We want to thank Bishop Cary, the pastors, the parishes, the pilgrim's families, and all who support the Bishop's Annual Appeal, for helping make this amazing experience possible. Faith was indeed strengthened, hearts were filled, and souls were blessed. And how many more will be strengthened, filled, and blessed by the experiences shared in the following days? If you know someone who attended this, or any other, World Youth Day, be sure to have a conversation with them – it could change your faith as well.

ONTARIO / JERICHO PRAYER


Father most merciful,
