doly Week is a time to reflect, pray, and draw closer to God. It spans from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, encompassing both the Church's most somber observances and its most joyous celebrations. The unique and beautiful liturgies throughout this week invite us to deepen our relationship with the Lord.

In preparation for Holy Week and Easter Vigil, Bishop Cary celebrated the Chrism Mass this past Thursday. This annual Mass highlights Christ's gift of priesthood to His Church. During the celebration, the Bishop gathers with his priests to renew their promises and bless the Holy Oils used in sacraments throughout the year. Just as the women found no scent of corruption at Christ's tomb on Easter morning, His Resurrection has infused the sacraments with the fragrance of eternal life, which Christians are called to spread throughout the world.

Beginning with Palm Sunday, Holy Week commemorates the final seven days leading up to Easter. On Palm Sunday, we remember Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. Wednesday, known as Spy Wednesday, marks Jesus' betrayal. Maundy Thursday (the ending of Lent and the beginning of the Triduum) observes the Last Supper, followed by Good Friday, which recalls Jesus' Passion. The Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday is the pinnacle of this week, transitioning from the solemnity of the Triduum to the glorious celebration of Easter Sunday. It is a celebration in which all who have completed their formation as catechumens are received into the church. It's often considered the most important liturgy of the year.

May the Risen Lord answer your prayers and give you an ever deepening share in his victory over death.

Be sure to check your parish for the schedule of services during this sacred week.



Acercándonos al Señor esta Semana Santa

a Semana Santa es un tiempo para reflexionar, orar y acercarnos a Dios. Abarca desde el Domingo de Ramos hasta el Domingo de Pascua, abarcando tanto las celebraciones más solemnes de la Iglesia como sus celebraciones más alegres. Las únicas y hermosas liturgias de esta semana nos invitan a profundizar nuestra relación con el Señor.

En preparación para la Semana Santa y la Vigilia Pascual, el Obispo Cary celebró la Misa Crismal este pasado Jueves. Esta Misa anual resalta el regalo de Cristo del sacerdocio a Su Iglesia. Durante la celebración, el Obispo se reúne con sus sacerdotes para renovar sus promesas y bendecir los Santos Óleos usados en los sacramentos a lo largo del año. Así como las mujeres no hallaron olor a corrupción en la tumba de Cristo la mañana de Pascua, su Resurrección ha impregnado los sacramentos con la fragancia de la vida eterna, que los Cristianos están llamados a difundir.

Comenzando con el Domingo de Ramos, la Semana Santa conmemora los últimos siete días previos a la Pascua. El Domingo de Ramos, recordamos la entrada triunfal de Cristo en Jerusalén. El Miércoles, conocido como el Miércoles del Espionaje (Spy Wednesday), conmemora la traición a Jesús. El Jueves Santo (final de la Cuaresma y comienzo del Triduo) celebra la Última Cena, seguido del Viernes Santo, que recuerda la Pasión de Jesús. La Vigilia Pascual el Sábado Santo es el punto culminante de esta semana, cambiando de la solemnidad del Triduo Pascual a la gloriosa celebración del Domingo de Pascua. Es una celebración en la que todos los que han completado su formación como catecúmenos son recibidos en la iglesia. A menudo se considera la liturgia más importante del año.

Que el Señor Resucitado responda a sus oraciones y les conceda una participación cada vez más profunda en su victoria sobre la muerte.


