

What is the Bishop's Annual Appeal?

The Bishop's Appeal is an annual campaign that supports the ministries of the Diocese. While parishes handle much of the Church's work, the Diocese provides essential specialized services and programs that individual parishes cannot manage alone. The Bishop's Annual Appeal serves as the Diocese's main fundraising effort for these vital ministries. By contributing to the Appeal, parishioners actively support the Bishop's outreach and the broader mission of the Church.

Who is being asked to support the Annual Diocesan Appeal?

Every Catholic household in the Diocese of Baker is being asked for their prayerful consideration of a gift to the Annual Appeal. Each parish is assigned a goal for the annual campaign. Faithful support from every family in the parish each year – regardless of the amount – helps the parish reach its goal.

What is the average gift and how much should I give?

The average gift to last year's Bishop's Annual Appeal was \$392. We encourage you to consider a donation of 1% or more of your annual income to support this yearly effort. Remember that even modest contributions have a significant impact when everyone participates.

Are Parish goals mandatory?

The 2025 Appeal parish goals are not mandatory. However, all parishes are expected to participate in the Appeal and secure significant in-pew pledges. While not required, each parish should aim to reach its assigned goal.

Is my pledge legally binding?

A pledge represents a commitment based on current circumstances. Should those circumstances change, adjustments to pledge payments and/or the outstanding balance can be made.

Is my contribution to the Bishop's Annual Appeal part of my tithe to the Church?

Yes, it definitely is. A helpful guideline is to consider donating 1% of your yearly income to the Appeal.

How is the Bishop's Annual Appeal goal determined?

The 2025 diocesan goal of \$710,000 for the annual appeal was calculated based on prior appeal involvement and the financial needs of the diocese. This target is determined similarly to previous years, considering the total annual Offertory from the preceding year, the diocese's ministry requirements, and the outcomes of the previous year's appeal.

What is the difference between a pledge and one-time gift?

A one time gift is exactly that, you give one donation for the whole year. A pledge on the other hand is an opportunity to give through installments throughout the year. It is generally a pre-determined amount per month and you set the duration or make it indefinite. Since you are giving over time it's an opportunity to increase your gift. When you decide to support the BAA we ask
