

Starting Out the New Year with a Holy Hour

For some people, New Year's Eve and New Year's Day are a big deal. They enjoy being at a party with family and friends. There are many who make it a point to watch the ball drop at Times Square on TV or in person. For me, although I had always loved Christmas, New Year's Eve and New Year's Day coming a week after Christmas Eve and the first day of Christmas was always a letdown. I was all partied out by the time December 25th was over. It was never a holiday that depressed me; I simply did not care about it or look forward to it.

That changed after experiencing New Year's in a Franciscan place known as Mt. Irenaeus. The Mountain, as it is sometimes called, is a community of friars and lay people in western New York State located on a large piece of forested land in Allegany County. There are a few houses, several cabins and a simple beautiful chapel with windows looking out on the surrounding forest with a view of the mountains.

As New Year's Eve ticked closer to midnight, the friars and several lay persons would do a contemplative walk from the main house on the property up a hill to the chapel. We would walk one -by-one in the fridged night air with enough space between each person so we could avoid talking and maintain silence. The walkers would enter the chapel to the sound of meditative music, the smell of incense and the relaxing glow of candle lights. It was the beginning of a holy hour. Although the content of that holy hour would change a little from year to year, from what I remember, the Blessed Sacrament was usually exposed for a period of silent adoration. We would pray Evening or night Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, listen to a biblical reading and do a shared reflection. It would end around midnight with the ringing of the chapel bell, a walk back down to the main house where there would be more bell ringing, along with clanking of pots and pans and a short celebration with food and drink. One year we even sent some fireworks into the night sky above the forest. So, there was a little partying.

Being immersed in the prayerful experience of a holy hour was for me a wonderful way to transition from one year to the next. For those who might have an interest in arranging for themselves a holy hour on New Year's Eve or Day but find it to be too congested with social activities, the first week of the year is a good time in general to make it happen. There are two special holy days that occur during that week: January 1st is the Solemnity of Mary the Holy Mother of God and January 6th is the traditional date for the Feast of the Epiphany – although in the U.S. we will be celebrating the coming Epiphany on Sunday, January 8th. You might find it helpful to make a holy hour for yourself in between those two feasts.

How does one arrange a holy hour? There is no one way to do it. If you want to give it a try, the first decision to make is whether you want to do it alone or with others. Making a holy hour with family and/or friends, or even as a couple, can be a great way to invite God into your shared life and strengthen your relationships. Setting up a prayerful environment is certainly part of the fun. Candles, incense, sacred images or natural objects like flowers or branches might help you to ease into the hour. A period of silence is always recommended. Making use of music, scripture or other non-biblical religious readings are conducive to prayer. You might want to try devising a ritual as part of your hour with God. For example, you can light small individual candles for particular prayer intentions and insert them in a snowbank outside or in a pot filled with soil or sand. Do not be afraid to experiment and be creative! You can also simply come to St. Mary's church and spend an hour in eucharistic adoration when we offer it on Thursdays from 4-5 PM or pray your favorite devotion. Our doors are usually open during the daytime for several hours. Whatever ways you choose to organize your holy hour, know that the most important thing is to make it something that is prayerful for yourself and for any others who might be joining you for it. Can there be a better way to set your new year on the right track!

Next Sunday, as we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, we will chalk the lintels of St. Mary's Church and invite God to bless everyone who comes into our Church building. We invite you to adopt this custom in your family. The family gathers and chalks their doorway to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows.

A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance, 20 + C + M + B + 23. The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also abbreviate the Latin words Christus mansionem benedicat, "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs represent the cross and 2023 is the year.

We will bless chalk and mark our doorways at the 5 p.m. Mass on January 7th and the 10:30 Mass on January 8th, and invite you to take a piece of chalk and do the same at your home!


