

On October 22nd the Apostolic Penitentiary released a Decree on with modifications to obtaining the Plenary Indulgence for the deceased in **November**. *The indulgence may be obtained by anyone who visits a cemetery, even if only mentally, any day in November, not just the 1st-8th, and devoutly prays for the faithful departed.*



The Plenary Indulgence attached to All Soul's Day on November 2nd as been extended to any other Sunday or day of the month chosen by each member of the faithful. In this case the indulgence is obtained by "devoutly visiting a church or an oratory", along with recitation of the Our Father and the Creed, and the usual requirements including Sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion and a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions.

Mass Guidelines in brief:

- Attendees should wear masks while entering church when walking up to receive communion and after.
- when leaving Mass mask during Mass is optional
- Social distancing (six-feet) should be practiced when entering the Church
- sitting in pews
- going to communion
- exiting church after mass

Donation basket located in front of altar. Donations can be dropped into basket when coming up for communion.

During communion form a single line observing the six-foot separation.
