

# Saint Francis of Assisi Parish

On Monday, January 4, our new parish, St. Francis of Assisi, officially begins. As we celebrate the Epiphany of the **Lord, the manifestation of God's love for us in the person of Jesus Christ, let us pray that God will continue to pour** out divine mercy upon us through our new parish. As the Magi brought their gifts to the new-born king, let us offer the gifts of ourselves, our time, talents, and treasure, for the success of our new parish. Let us pray that our united parish will be a joyful witness to the reality of divine love in our world today.

Tomorrow we welcome Fr. Matthew McClain as our Pastor, and Fr. Louis Pascazi as one of our Senior Parochial Vicars. Fr. Ward Stakem, OFM, Cap. and Fr. James Kurtz, OFM, Cap. will also be Senior Parochial Vicars, completing the clergy team for our new parish, St. Francis of Assisi, as well as the newly formed parish of St. Clare of Assisi. Despite sharing a united pastoral team, St. Francis and St. Clare will remain separate parishes. Continue to pray for our clergy team and staff as they learn and navigate these changes. We pray that the united strength and dedication of our newly formed parishes guided by our new clergy team, will help us focus on our Vision, to be *A Community of the Faithful, Animated and Transformed by the Spirit, to lead the People of our Time to God.* 

Part of taking 3 parishes and merging them together as 1 is having one Parish Data System. Offertory envelopes will still be mailed to each user as always, but every parishioner now has a new number for St. Francis of Assisi. We realize that at the beginning there may still be old envelopes trickling in, we will be sure they are credited to the correct parishioners. A lot of thought and work has gone in to comparing all of the collections used by our individual parishes and what was best to use or forego moving forward. Of course Sunday offertory, Holy Days and Diocesan collections will all remain the same. Any changes are minor, we used the best options from each parish for the new parish. There will be a Parish Share Program envelope (Green PSP logo on white) the first Sunday of every month. This will be how ALL PSP funds are collected moving forward. Pledge cards will no longer be utilized. Every family should have received their first packet of envelopes from St. Francis of Assisi. If you haven't, or have any other questions, please contact the parish office. We appreciate your patience as we all work to move forward together.

As our new parish begins on January 4, we will also begin a new Sacramental Register. All baptisms, first communions, confirmations, marriages and deaths will be recorded in the new St. Francis of Assisi Register. All existing registers from the three former parishes will be retained at the Diocese of Pittsburgh Archives & Records Center. If you need proof of a sacrament for any reason moving forward, you will need to contact the Archives & Records Center directly. 

#### LIVE THE LITURGY

#### Inspiration for the week

Even the slightest flicker of a light helps to properly orient us when we find ourselves in total darkness. Being in darkness can be unsettling and even a bit unnerving. We lose our focus and struggle to find our bearings and achieve balance. On life's journey we may think we are walking in the light but are really lingering in darkness. We do not see the full picture, either because we are distracted, disinterested, or even apprehensive. Sometimes, we even choose to close our eyes when the light is readily available to illuminate our path. Do we really desire to know the truth of who we are? In Jesus Christ, a light has been given to those who dwell in darkness. God's revelation gives us the light to see where we come from, who we are and where we are going. It also tells us that this Good News is not meant for just a privileged few but is intended to go out to all the world. Is this something we want to see?

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION

#### **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

"Where is that thing?" mumbled Bob as he searched frantically on his dimly lit desk for the current electric bill. "I know I put it right on top of these papers this morning!" Growing in frustration and bordering on anger, he flies stuff around, moves books and opines why simple tasks need to be so hard. Enter his wife, who calmly says, "Maybe it would help if you put the light on, dear." The desk light goes on and lo and behold, there is the electric bill right where Bob left it earlier. All it took was a little light!

We stubbornly refuse to turn on the lights! Either we are distracted, determined, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Or perhaps, we fail to do the obvious. We would rather live our lives with the dimmest of lights or even in total darkness. Why are we afraid to do something so that we can actually see? It might help us to find quicker and better answers to problems, the meaning of life, relationships, happiness, and what is ultimate truth. Yet, we stumble along, moving things from one side to the other, getting angry, feeling cheated, being unsettled, resigning ourselves to the agony of defeat once again.

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was." The light has come into the world in the person of Jesus Christ! We no longer have to fumble in the darkness. We have been gifted with the illumination we need to see our way through things and find what we really are looking for. All these years later, however, so many are still reluctant to accept him. Perhaps they are unconvinced, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Everyone has their own reason for not wanting to turn on the switch.

But there are so many answers to so many of our problems in this humble Child of Nazareth. A simple birth teaches us about God's tender wedded relationship with humanity. It speaks to the expanse of God's salvation across the globe, and the incarnate Divine wonders and blessings that are a part of our life moment to moment. It calls us to understand the design of world order God intended as found in the Beatitudes, the sacredness of every human life and all of creation and the meaning of things we struggle with most, like suffering and death. We have a lot of Good News to share, not just with a privileged few but with all the world. All races and creeds can receive God's healing word. God continues to manifest himself even now! Use the light to find what you are really looking for!


You may have noticed that St. John's doors are missing. With part of our Church Alive! funds, allocated to restoring items construction within the Church, the main doors and



# Epiphany Blessing of the Home

On the Feast of the Epiphany, the family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above the home's entrance. The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the Three Magi:

Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar who were sanctified by their adoration of the infant Jesus. They also abbreviate the Latin words, "Christus mansionem benedicat," meaning, "May Christ bless



#### WASH YOUR HANDS


Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds using soap and water. If you can't wash your hands, use hand sanitizer frequently.




