





Inspiration for the week

The immensity, scope, intimacy, and pervasiveness of God's presence is too intense for the human mind. We often limit God by our expectations of Him and have a hard time just letting God be God. Some people all too easily lose faith because God does not meet their expectations. Worse still, the idea of faith is rejected altogether by others because of polarities and experiences they have that don't square with who they need God to be. The Holy Trinity is one of those teachings that is best encountered rather than dissected. It is only through being present with the Trinity that we can experience both the immensity and otherness of God's presence as well as the intimacy of the God who wants us to call Him "dad." We feel the loving guidance of a God who wants to take us from fear and give us confidence. Our God of yesterday, today, and tomorrow is a God of all ages whose three-fold Presence invades all senses, seasons, and times. God, who is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is much more than any of our expectations if we simply let God be who God is.

A message from Fr. Matt . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity; our belief in God who is three persons, the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, yet one God undivided in unity. This Trinity is intimately close to us, yet is a mystery. We invoke the Trinity so many times, before meals, during Mass, every time we make the Sign of the Cross, every time that we pray. But if we had to explain it theologically, each of us, especially me, would be hard-pressed. But maybe that is the problem.

The Trinity is not revealed to us so that we can explain it. I love the idea that the Trinity is a kenotic relationship, meaning each member pours himself fully into the other. As each is emptied, they are simultaneously filled by the self-emptying of the other. That is a beautiful image. But does it fully explain the awesomeness and mystery of the Trinity? Heck, no. But that is ok, because I'm not sure that God cares whether we fully understand the Trinity. But I do believe that God cares that we understand and experience our role in it.

What does that mean, our role in it? Earlier I said that the Trinity is very intimate to us. We invoke the Trinity all the time. But sometimes it seems that we don't understand what we are doing when we make the Sign of the Cross. Just like everything in our faith, it is not only for us.

One of my best friends from Seminary is a priest in South Carolina. He is a great priest. The thing is, he grew up Methodist and had never heard of Catholicism until fourth grade. A new kid had come to his school. At lunch, the new boy made the Sign of the Cross and prayed before he ate. When my friend saw this, he became curious. What the heck was that? He went home and asked his mom what a Catholic was. When she couldn't explain it, he looked Catholicism up in an encyclopedia! Long-story-short, 15 years later, not only was my friend a Catholic, he was a Catholic priest. The new kid invoked the Trinity and made the sign of the Cross, but not just for him. Think about how many lives were changed, how many thousands of Parishioners, just by this one moment of prayer. Many times we make the Sign of the Cross and ask the Lord to help us, protect us, and keep us safe. That is all good and right, but there is more. My friend's story shows what I mean.

The Trinity isn't just a mystery to marvel at, it is something that we live in. As members of the Body of Christ, we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and call God "Our Father". We live in the midst of the Trinity. It is flowing all around us. We can experience it. Last week, I jumped into the bitter cold Atlantic Ocean. Do I now know the fullness of the Atlantic? No. But did I experience the Atlantic? I sure did. I think that God isn't so worried that we understand the theological principle, but that we remember who we are and where we live and move. We are made in the image of this God who is three persons, none of whom is about himself. Each lives totally unselfishly for the other. If that is who we are, and the Trinity is where we live, don't worry about figuring it out, just go with it. This week, try some unselfish love. Dive under a wave and live like a member of the Trinity. God shows us that a life of self-emptying love will never be empty, for we will be filled by the love of others. So what do you think? We are standing on the shore. The waves are rolling up on our toes.

The Trinity is ready for us not just to think about it, but to experience it. Run in. It may be a little cold, a little new, a little uncomfortable at first. But once you dive under a wave or two, you'll be ok. Remember who you are and where you live. Do some unselfish loving.

Feel yourself being filled back up by the love of others. Experience the Trinity!

Christian Mothers Movement Grows

This is a love story, a story that cascades through generations, sails across oceans, and gains momentum in the human spirit of women. Women of faith, that is.

This is the love story of the Christian Mothers.

In the post French Revolution era where secularism reigned supreme, women longed to defend and promote their Catholic faith. In response, Christian Mothers was founded in Lille, France in 1850. Members committed to supporting each other spiritually, while raising their children Catholic.

In time, the organization grew to over one million members in Europe. When the Capuchin friars immigrated to the United States from Bavaria, they brought the rich traditions of the Christian Mothers organization with them.

National Director Fr. Joseph Tuscan, OFM Cap., recently reflected on the genesis of the Christian Mothers founders who experienced the outright assault on their Catholic faith: "Necessity is the mother of invention.



They decided they needed to begin on their knees...it's got to begin with prayer. It's going to have a return to authentic devotional life. They knew it had to have a catechetical part, an intellectual part, and an apostolic part. Smart women. They put all that in place from the very beginning."

Now deceased Capuchin Fr. Bertin Roll, National Executive Director for more than 60 years, penned this about Christian Mothers: "Mothers rule the world. They guide the destinies of homes. This is why God is relying on mothers to keep Christ in the world by keeping Him in their hearts and homes."

Christian Mothers throughout the decades, have turned to "Mother Love," a 308-page book of prayers to guide them in their spiritual life.

But Christian Mothers do more than pray. They actively fundraise and share the fruits of their



laborers. For example, in Nigeria the Christian Mothers pay for the seminarian education of three students annually. They have built orphanages and funded a \$1 million facility for widowed women to help them learn a trade. Christian Mothers teach about marriage and family life. They work to help the poor and often prepare mercy meals for funerals.

Fr. Joseph reports the Christian Mothers movement is growing; 20 new fraternities were established in the United States last year. A new fraternity in Tanzania recently requested 800 membership pins!

"It's a wonderful movement. I'm amazed, not just that it still exists, but the quality of women that are in it is just incredible...here and overseas," Tuscan said. "The work they do, the intelligence, the effort they put in...on their own initiative, just like the women who started it, they push it along. The Holy Spirit has been guiding this group.

"It's a historical, thought out, well-rehearsed model. It's something that has worked for generations and more women are rediscovering it all the time."
