## A message from Fr. Matt . . .

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. We celebrate the fact that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. That at the consecration, the bread and wine that is brought forward is really, truly and substantially transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. We believe this because Jesus said so! Jesus did not say "this is to remind you of the Last Supper." Jesus did not say "this is a symbol that points to Me." Jesus said "This is my Body." Jesus said "This is my Blood." Jesus said "Do this."

So we do and we believe.

When we look at all of the readings for this Feast, they all focus on covenant. God's covenant with Israel is described in the First Reading. Our salvation through the covenant is described in the Psalm. Jesus is called the mediator of the New Covenant in the Second Reading. In the Gospel, Jesus shows us the New Covenant in His blood.

A covenant is an agreement between at least two parties, each side commits. In the First Reading, God makes the commitment to save Israel. Israel commits that "all that the Lord has said, we will heed and do."

The covenant is sealed by the blood of a sacrifice. The New Covenant far exceeds this. In the Sacrifice of Jesus Christ, God commits to saving us not just from other nations, but from ourselves, our sins, and Satan. His commitment is for our eternal salvation. So what is our end of the deal? What are the commands of the New Covenant? Love God. Love others before yourself. And "do this." Do what? Believe and receive the Eucharist.



I know this past year has given some of us a new appreciation for the Eucharist. I felt so guilty and also very blessed during the early part of the shut down when the churches were closed and you could not receive the Eucharist, that I could receive. So many of you spoke so beautifully about your desire to receive communion and were so joyful when you could again. This is wonderful because receiving the Eucharist is a part of our commitment in the New Covenant. We need to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. Now some of you may say that you enjoyed watching the live stream of Mass and maybe feel like this is enough for you. I'm glad you like it. I'm glad you get something out of it. But it is not enough. Sometimes our health dictates that we cannot come to Mass. But sometimes we just get used to not coming. You need Jesus in the Eucharist. So do I. Is this just my opinion? Nope. Jesus said so. Encourage your friends and family who have not been coming to Mass and receiving the Eucharist to come and receive Jesus. They need it. The Eucharist is the way that God allows us to participate in the New Covenant that saves us.

So today is a great and challenging feast. It is a feast that is about the New Covenant. It is a feast about doing. God wins our salvation by the Body and Blood of His Son Jesus, broken and poured out for us. But we also have a part to play. Don't get me wrong, God is not asking us to win our salvation. He has already done that. God is asking us, to accept our salvation. We do this by loving God and our neighbor and receiving the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus. We do this by going to Communion. We believe that this is true because Jesus told us it is true. That is enough for me. Is it enough for you?

The Diocese of Pittsburgh has contracted with Ethics Point, an independent third-party service that provides hotline services to organizations, companies and other dioceses around the country. The Ethics and Compliance Hotline is now accessible through an "Ethics Point" link at the top of the diocesan website. This hotline allows individuals to communicate financial and employee misconduct concerns involving any parish, school, diocesan office or diocesan employee. Concerns can be submitted anonymously (if desired) and confidentially by phone or online without fear of retaliation.

Examples of misconduct that should be reported to the hotline include but are not limited to:

- \* Theft or fraud
- \* Misuse of parish or diocesan assets
- \* Embezzlement
- \* Destroying, altering or falsifying any parish, school or diocesan records, contracts or reports
- \* Improper dealings with vendors and conflicts of interest
- \* Workplace Safety
- \* Human Resource matters
- \* Personal threats or physical violence

## Christian Mothers Movement Grows

This is a love story, a story that cascades through generations, sails across oceans, and gains momentum in the human spirit of women. Women of faith, that is.

This is the love story of the Christian Mothers.

In the post French Revolution era where secularism reigned supreme, women longed to defend and promote their Catholic faith. In response, Christian Mothers was founded in Lille, France in 1850. Members committed to supporting each other spiritually, while raising their children Catholic.

In time, the organization grew to over one million members in Europe. When the Capuchin friars immigrated to the United States from Bavaria, they brought the rich traditions of the Christian Mothers organization with them.

National Director Fr. Joseph Tuscan, OFM Cap., recently reflected on the genesis of the Christian Mothers founders who experienced the outright assault on their Catholic faith: "Necessity is the mother of invention.

They decided they needed to begin on their knees...it's got to begin with prayer. It's going to have a return to authentic devotional life. They knew it had to have a catechetical part, an intellectual part, and an apostolic part. Smart women. They put all that in place from the very beginning."



Now deceased Capuchin Fr. Bertin Roll, National Executive Director for more than 60 years, penned this about Christian Mothers: "Mothers rule the world. They guide the destinies of homes. This is why God is relying on mothers to keep Christ in the world by keeping Him in their hearts and homes."

Christian Mothers throughout the decades, have turned to "Mother Love," a 308-page book of prayers to guide them in their spiritual life.



But Christian Mothers do more than pray. They actively fundraise and share the fruits of their

labors. For example, in Nigeria the Christian Mothers pay for the seminarian education of three students annually. They have built orphanages and funded a \$1 million facility for widowed women to help them learn a trade. Christian Mothers teach about marriage and family life. They work to help the poor and often prepare mercy meals for funerals.

Fr. Joseph reports the Christian Mothers movement is growing; 20 new fraternities were established in the United States last year. A new fraternity in Tanzania recently requested 800 membership pins!

"It's a wonderful movement. I'm amazed, not just that it still exists, but the quality of women that are in it is just incredible...here and overseas," Tuscan said. "The work they do, the intelligence, the effort they put in...on their own initiative, just like the women who started it, they push it along. The Holy Spirit has been guiding this group.

"It's a historical, thought out, well-rehearsed model. It's something that has worked for generations and more women are rediscovering it all the time."


