



There is no wrong way to pray . . . just pray

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

When I was probably 10 years old I went to a show at Heinz

Hall with my mom and dad. I don't remember what the show was. I don't remember if any of my brothers or sisters were with me, although some of them probably were. All that I remember is the person who was sitting directly in front of me. We were sitting in the second row. In front of us was Dan Rooney, the owner of the Steelers. That is probably why I don't remember the show, because all that I could do was watch Dan Rooney!

When the show was over and the lights came on Mr. Rooney stood up and turned around and said hello to my dad. He called my dad by name! I guess my dad had seen him as a patient once. I hadn't known that. Then the big moment came. My dad turned to me, put his hand on my shoulder and said "I'd like you to meet my son, Matt." Dan Rooney stuck out his hand for me to shake. He said that it was nice to meet me. And I ....ugggh I hate to even say this...put a pen in his hand and asked for an autograph. I know. My dad squeezed my shoulder and told me to shake the man's hand. I knew right away that I'd messed up. Mr. Rooney was so good about it. He laughed, shook my hand and then gave me an autograph. He was quite a gentleman. My dad was disappointed. I felt stupid. I was in the presence of this great man, and I had kind of panicked. I judged myself hard about that interaction for many years.

The First Reading and the Gospel this week teach us about prayer. How do you pray? What is the best way to pray? In the Gospel, the disciples ask Jesus to teach them to pray. He responds by teaching them the Our Father. This prayer is found both in Luke's Gospel and in Matthew's. Did you ever have a friend in another denomination ask you why Catholics cut off the end of the Our Father? The answer is found here. We don't. We end it where Jesus ends it! We like to follow Jesus and the Scriptures in our Church! Tell your friend that. It will annoy them! The Our Father is a beautiful prayer. It is intimate but also respectful. It praises God and also seeks God's help. The Our Father is a great model for prayer.

What stands out so strongly to me this week however, is not just this great model for prayer that Jesus gives us, but what He says after this. When we hold the Gospel together with the First Reading and Abraham's conversation with God, it seems that the Lord this week is encouraging us to be persistent in our prayer.

So often in my life, when I would stop to pray, I would feel like I did sitting in that second row at Heinz Hall. I wouldn't know what to say or what to do. I would just fall back on the prayers that we are all taught growing up. I would not know what to say, so I would say the Our Father, Hail Mary, the Glory Be, the Memorare. Do you know what is wrong about praying like this? Nothing! There are other ways to pray as well. Abraham is in an intense conversation with God. Do you pray like that? Do you know what is wrong with that? Nothing! Sometimes you will see people praying with their hands up. That's great! If you don't pray like that, that's great too. We don't need to judge ourselves or others based on the way we pray. But the thing that the Lord is telling us today is that we have an opportunity. We can speak with the Most High God. Just Pray.

That is what the Lord put on my heart this week. Don't judge the way you pray. Just pray! In whatever way works for you. If one way doesn't seem to be getting you anywhere, try another. Just don't give up. Keep praying.

The Lord has given us a model for prayer. We would be wise to try it. Throughout the history of the Church, people have found other ways of prayer that are effective for them. We would be wise to look at those too and see if they work for us. But there is no one way to pray. Just keep showing up to pray.

When I put that pen in Mr. Rooney's hand and saw my dad's reaction I felt so bad, so dumb. Granted, it was not the most polite or respectful thing to do. But Mr. Rooney responded with such grace and kindness. God your Heavenly Father will respond to whatever way you show up to Him, with grace and kindness as well. So don't get discouraged. Don't judge yourself harshly. Just show up. Just pray.




