



LORD, MAKE ME AN INSTRUMENT OF YOUR PEACE.





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The other day I was visiting my sister and she told me to be careful at the intersection of Beadling and Washington Roads. It is a busy intersection, and one that at certain times of the day is very busy, both with cars and pedestrians. Kids walking home from the high school, remember this is Mt. Lebanon so no buses, tend to cross the street without looking. So, my sister said to make eye contact with the pedestrian before you pull out on to the road. The kids usually have ear buds in, listening to music. So



much of the technology today is so cool, but sometimes it also separates us or distances us from reality.

I think the Readings for this week remind us of what is real and provide a remedy for the solipsism of our world today. I had to slip that word in there. Solipsism. It means that we think that the sun revolves around us. It is a fancy way to say that we are caught up in a false narrative that everything is about us. What the Readings spell out for us is the reality of who we are, why we are here, and who or what we need to be concerned about.

In the Gospel for today, Jesus calls his followers "salt" and "light." The thing about salt and light is that neither of them are for themselves. Everyone loves a little salt, but would you sit down and eat a bowl of salt? No way! But that isn't what salt is for. Salt is about what it is put on or in. It brings out the flavor of the other or preserves the other from spoiling. Salt is not solipsistic. Salt is in fact, ancillary. That is, it is in service of the other. The same thing goes with light. Light doesn't light itself and then just appreciate it's own radiance. No. Light is used not for itself, but for others, so that they might be able to see or be warmed. Light is ancillary, not solipsistic.

The First Reading and the Responsorial Psalm tell the same story. We are not here to be all about ourselves. If we are not all about ourselves but are about others, "light will rise for you in the darkness," says Isaiah in the First Reading and "his horn shall be exalted in glory" says the Psalm.

So, we are called to be ancillary rather than solipsistic. To be for others rather than ourselves. We have two great examples of how we were made to live. After Mary received the message from the Angel Gabriel, in Luke 1: 38 Mary says; "Behold I am the handmaid of the Lord." The Latin word for "handmaid" is ancilla, which is the root of the word, ancillary. Mary says she is the Lord's servant! She is not all about her, she is all about the Lord and what the Lord is doing. She is an approachable model for us, because she is one of us. She is what we were made to be. A person for others. The Second Reading shows us the greatest model. "Jesus Christ, and Him Crucified." We are made to be about others. To not be for ourselves. To not be solipsistic. But this is not too burdensome because we have a God who is all about us! The Creator of the world died on the Cross for us. If anyone has the right to be solipsistic it is the One who actually created the sun, but He isn't. Our Lord is ancillary. He came not for Himself, but to serve and to save those whom He loves!

This week let's hear the Lord's challenge. Whatever ear buds you wear in your life, I mean that meta-phorically and really, let's take them out. You were not made just for yourself. Be a person for others. Be ancillary. Be salt. Be light.



REFLECT

In Evangelium vitae (The Gospel of Life), Pope John Paul II applauds the daily heroism of mothers who selflessly devote themselves to their children. This modern-day saint also highlights the unfortunate reality that "these heroic women do not always find support in the world around them." He goes on to say, "On the contrary, the cultural models frequently promoted and broadcast by the media do not encourage motherhood. In the name of progress and modernity the values of fidelity, chastity, sacrifice, to which a host of Christian wives and mothers have borne and continue to bear outstanding witness, are presented as obsolete" (EV 86).

A culture that fails to truly value motherhood naturally becomes hostile to the gift of new life. When the Church compassionately serves mothers, it witnesses to the beauty of human life. There is a great need for real, tangible assistance for expectant mothers. Christ calls us to serve those most alone and in need. In a world that often turns it back on mothers who sacrifice so much of themselves, may we, the Church's members, rise to help mothers in need of assistance and support.
