EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

JANUARY 5, 2020

From Colleen ...

As I was preparing to write this New Year reflection, a warm fuzzy memory from my choir days came to me, particularly a song we had sung for the Epiphany of the Lord:

> We have traveled from afar, following a wondrous star, For it leads the way to the child they say, oh how joyful we are, Follow, follow that wondrous star, follow, follow wherever you are, It will guide you through the night, so follow that star to thy perfect light. (Lyrics from Follow That Wondrous Star written by Mary Donnelly and George L. O. Strid)

Epiphany gets its name right here, in the story of the three astrologers from the East. They saw a sign in the heavens, correctly understood it and chose to follow it, no matter the personal cost. These three are fearless pilgrims, walking in the tiny light of a star, traveling by faith. They are called wise because they search the heavens and their dreams for direction from a source they cannot name. And in their zeal, they find the One they are looking for.

It is interesting that St. Paul tells the Ephesians that the Gentiles are also heirs to the promise of salvation in the second reading this weekend. The astrologers were the first Gentile followers of Jesus. Without the benefit of Scripture or the stories of salvation, without religion and its rituals, they made their way into the presence of Christ. Many have since followed in their winding footsteps, through many places and years, searching for the light that they do not entirely understand but are willing to risk everything for. Some will find their way to the light, with or without our encouragement.

As we begin the New Year let's ask ourselves this: Are we fearless and zealous travellers in our faith? Do we take the time to understand our faith and follow it no matter the cost? Who do we know that is searching for the "light" they may not entirely understand? Are we full of joyful encouragement to journey with them? We may be the "star" to someone in our family, our workplace or in our community. We can't help but reflect the "perfect light" of Christ if we stay always basking in His light ... So follow, follow wherever you are!
